Project Background

- Provides assistance to qualifying homeowners to repair or replace malfunctioning or failing on-site sewage facilities (OSSFs).
- Funding may also be used to provide extension of first-time sewer service, pump-out and sludge hauling, etc.
- Eligible homeowners are not charged for any portion of the cost of the project (no homeowner cost share).



Applicant Qualifications

Must own and reside at the property

 Must be at or below 80% of the median household income for the county

 Must have a failing on-site sewage facility (includes those who have no system)



Applicant Referrals

- H-GAC watershed-based planning meetings and outreach events held throughout the region
- Outreach by Texas AgriLife Extension/TWRI in the coastal counties
- Authorized Agents (non-TCEQ funding can be used even by those under enforcement)
- OSSF Installers and Maintenance Providers
- Signs posted at installation/repair sites




Project Activity (as of April 30, 2019)

- 8 OSSF Repairs Completed
- 2 OSSF Repairs Awarded to Vendors (not completed)
- 8 OSSF Installations Completed
- 13 OSSF Installations Awarded to Vendors (not completed)
- An additional 26 candidates have met the qualifications for the program



Category Descriptions

- Completed a repair or replacement has been successfully completed and invoice processed.
- Awarded work has been awarded to a vendor and a purchase order issued. Funds have been allocated for the work, but work has not yet been completed.
- In Progress applicant has been approved for the program, but work has not yet been awarded to a vendor.
 Funds have not been allocated.


