



2011 REGIONAL STORM DEBRIS MANAGEMENT ASSESSMENT PLAN WORKSHOP CURRICULUM

In response to Tropical Storm Allison H-GAC completed the 2003 Regional Storm Debris Management Assessment (RSDMA) Plan to analyze the disaster preparedness of counties and cities within the region and identify how H-GAC can assist the region with debris management planning. Subsequent debris-generating events since 2003, such as Hurricane Rita in 2005 and Hurricane Ike in 2008, have tested the preparedness of counties, municipalities, and other governmental agencies within the region. Consequently, H-GAC has developed a 2011 RSDMA plan to assess the current disaster preparedness of the counties and cities within the region.

The 2011 RSDMA Plan Workshop will present the findings and recommendations of the updated plan and will also provide a review of debris management best practices and will discuss new Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) guidance, policies, and procedures as they relate to debris management.
