

Defining the CMP Process

Three key elements:

- Identify congestion and its causes (in region)
- Apply mitigation strategies to improve system
- Evaluate strategies' effectiveness



The Importance of the CMP

- Funding strategies should emerge from the CMP
- Can be independent, but usually considered with RTP and TIP
- Last CMP Update conducted in 2015; original in 2011
- CMP required under Fix America Surface Transportation (FAST) Act
- In 2020 an approved CMP Update is required for MPO recertification
- MPO recertification expected to occur in early 2021



Eight Elements (Steps) of CMP

- 1. Develop Regional Objectives
- 2. Define Parameters of Regional Network
- 3. Develop Multimodal Performance Measures
- 4. Collect and Monitor System Performance
- 5. Analyze Congestion Problems and Needs
- 6. Identify and Assess Strategies
- 7. Program and Implement Strategies
- 8. Evaluate Strategy Effectiveness



2020 CMP Update Highlights

- Will include greater multimodal emphasis
- Will create an accessible and transparent CMP
- Consider impacts of COVID 19


Regional Transportation Plan (RTP) Purpose



- Federally required
- Minimum 20-year outlook
- Updated every 4 years
- Targets federal, state, local resources for transportation investments
- Aligns with federal, state, regional, local vision
- Fiscally constrained

20+ Year Regional Transportation Plan (2045 RTP)



Spring/Summer 2022	Conduct public survey/outreach; develop AQ conformity scenarios; incorporate Federal/State requirements
Fall 2022	Finalize Vision/Goals/Objectives; finalize regional profile; develop funding schedule and project evaluations
Spring 2023	Develop initial draft; stakeholder/public review of draft




