Voter-approved measure which directs a portion of revenues destined for the State's "Rainy Day Fund" to TxDOT roadway projects

FY 15 Funding—\$1.74 billion statewide

\$278 million allocated to H-GAC/TxDOT Houston District SEXULAGE

Legislative/TxDOT direction:

- No toll roads—State highway system facilities only
- Expedite project delivery
