The presiding officer, Chairman David Robinson called the Transportation Policy Council (TPC) meeting of March 24, 2023 at 9:30 a.m. to order.

ITEM 1 & 2 CERTIFICATION OF QUORUM AND INTRODUCTIONS

Chairman David Robinson recognized Mr. James Garland, H-GAC, for the Certification of the Quorum and conducted the Roll Call of the TPC membership. Fourteen (14) members comprise a quorum. A quorum was declared present and recorded on the Roll Call, which is included with these Minutes as Attachment 1.

Mr. James Garland, H-GAC, began the presentation by informing the Council that Spanish translation services were available. Once public comment was received by the 5:00 p.m. deadline on March 23rd. Mr. Garland read it to the Council. Mr. Garland asked Ms. Lourdes McIntyre to introduce herself and she gave instructions to the public in Spanish on how to make comments online. Mr. Garland explained that American Sign Language services were available online in Zoom and introduced sign language interpreters Kenneth Niemietz and Antonio Ramos.

<u>6.Recognition of Commendation for Greater Houston Freight Committee Outgoing Co-Chairs Judge Ed Emmettand Mr. Brian Fielkow</u>

Chairman David Robinson and Mr. Craig Raborn, H-GAC, recognized the Outgoing Co-Chairs Judge Ed Emmett and Mr. Brian Fielkow. Mr. Raborn told the Council that both Judge Emmett and Mr. Fielkow had served very honorably on the Greater Houston Freight Committee leading that committee's work since its inception in 2016. The committee has been valuable to the region and engaged in critical studies that were done prior to his arrival as well as the Regional Goods Movement Study that is ongoing.

Chairman David Robinson called for a motion approving the recognition of both the outgoing members. A motion was made by Mayor Joe Zimmerman and seconded by Judge Mark Keough. Chairman David Robinson read TPC Resolution No. 2023-12 for Judge Ed Emmet and TPC Resolution No. 2023-13 for Mr. Brian Fielkow to the Council and invited them to stand before the Council. Comments were made by members of the TPC commending Judge Ed Emmett and Mr. Brian Fielkow on their service to the Houston-Galveston region. Judge Ed Emmett and Mr. Brian Fielkow both thanked the Council for this recognition. The current Co-Chairs of the Greater Houston Freight Committee Mr. Billy Combs and Bruce Mann were invited to take a photo with the TPC officers and Outgoing members. The Council voted and approved TPC Resolution No. 2023-12 and TPC Resolution No. 2023-13.

ITEM 7. AMENDMENTS TO THE 2023-2026 TRANSPORATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM (TIP) AND THE 2045 REGIONAL TRANSPORTATION PLAN (RTP) REQUEST APPROVAL OF RESOLUTION 2023-14, MR. JIM DICKINSON, H-GAC

Mr. Jim Dickinson, H-GAC, gave a presentation on the Amendments to the 2022-2026 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) and the 2045 Regional Transportation Plan (RTP). A summary of the proposed revisions to the 2023-2026 TIP and 2045 RTP are included below for the Council's review:

• Program METRO's Federal Transit Administration Transit Oriented Development Planning award (MPO ID 18884) with \$376K of federal Section 5309 Transit Capital Investment Program funds which will be matched with \$94K of local funding in FY 2023. (+\$470K)

- Program the Near Northwest Management District's FY 2022 Congressional Community Projects earmark award (MPO ID 18885) with \$1.0M of federal Category-10 funds which will be matched with \$250K of local funding in FY 2023. (+\$1.3M)
- Clarify the limit of the TxDOT (Texas Department of Transportation) Houston District SH 99 Segment B-2 tollway construction project (MPOID 18872), change the sponsor to Brazoria County and delay the letting to FY 2027 of the Ten-Year Plan to allow more time to evaluate the financing. (Total Cost: \$604.9M)
- Clarify the limit of the TxDOT Houston District SH 99 Segment-B tollway construction project (MPOID 257) due to multiple intersections with FM 1462. (Total Cost: \$203.2M)
- Add \$24M total (\$19.2M Federal and \$4.8M State Match) of Surface Transportation Block Grant (STBG) funding to the TxDOT Houston District SH 99 Segment-D tollway construction project (MPOID 18022) for construction of sound walls, frontage road intersection improvement and detention ponds required by Atlas 14 standards. (+\$24.0M; Total Cost: \$83.0M)
- Add \$6.4M (\$5.1M Federal and \$1.3M State Match) of STBG funding to the TxDOT Houston District SH 99 Segment-D tollway construction project (MPOID 18021) for construction of sound walls and a frontage road intersection improvement at Kingsland Boulevard. (+\$6.4M; Total Cost: \$26.5M)
- Advance the TxDOT Houston District SH 99 Segment B-1 tollway construction project (MPOID 283) to FY 2025 to align its letting date with the adjacent SH 99 construction project MPO 257 (Total Cost: \$257.0M)
- Add Right-of-Way ('ROW') as an authorized phase with \$1.7M of federal ROW funding to the TxDOT Houston District FM 517 reconstruction and widening project (MPOID 16320) per TxDOT ROW Division policy. Delay to FY 2028 due to Right-of-Way issues. (+\$1.7M; Total Cost: \$16.2M)
- Add Right-of-Way ('ROW') as an authorized phase with \$12.5M of federal and state ROW funding to the TxDOT Houston District FM 518 reconstruction and widening project (MPOID 10132) per TxDOT ROW Division policy. Delay to FY 2026 due to Right-of-Way and design issues. (+\$12.5M; Total Cost: \$53.7M)
- Add Right-of-Way ('ROW') as an authorized phase with \$1.1M of federal ROW funding to the TxDOT Houston District SL 336 widening project (MPOID 16343) per TxDOT ROW Division policy.
 (+\$1.1M; Total Cost: \$21.2M)
- Update the project description of the TxDOT Houston District IH 45 South reconstruction and widening project (MPOID 282) to incorporate the direct connector construction transferred from MPOID 15490. Delay to FY 2025 due to environmental permitting, Right-of-Way, and utilities issues. (Total Cost: \$108.6M)
- Update the project description of the TxDOT Houston District SL 8 frontage roads access management implementation project (MPOID 18035) with additional details to resolve a FHWA STIP 'Exception'. Delay to FY 2026 due to design issues. (Total Cost: \$9.0M)

 Advance TxDOT Houston District SH 99 Segment B-1 construction (MOD ID 283) to FY 2025 to coordinate letting with adjoining SH 99 project (Total: \$257.0M)

ITEM 8. PROJECT SELECTION PROCESS, VISHU LINGALA, H-GAC

Mr. Vishu Lingala, H-GAC, updated the Council on the Project Selection Process. Mr. Lingala told the Council that staff received statements of interest for 622 projects and 32 sponsors of which 461 were to be included in the project selection process for a total of \$33 billion. Of the 461 projects submitted it includes some projects that are already programmed in the RTP, TIP and 10-year plan. Some agencies such as TxDOT, Counties or local governments submitted more than one project. Also included are projects that were not submitted previously. Mr. Lingala also described the short-term statements of interest by investment categories and funding instructions as well as the next steps for the Regional Goods Movement project evaluation and let the Council know that staff have shared it with the TIP Subcommittee and will share it on the H-GAC website. Mr. Lingala also described the Operational Improvements and Congestion Management investment category focused criteria and planning factors. Mr. Lingala concluded his presentation with the next steps to initiate the project selection process. Comments, questions and answers occurred after the presentation.

ITEM 9. AIR QUALITY CONFORMITY AND 2045 REGIONAL TRANSPORTION PLAN (RTP) UPDATE, GRACIELA LUBERTINO AND ANITA HOLLMANN-MATIJCIO, H-GAC

Ms. Graciela Lubertino, H-GAC, gave a presentation on the Air Quality Conformity and 2045 Regional Transportation Plan (RTP) update. Ms. Lubertino gave a recap on what Air Conformity is and how it links the air quality state implantation, regional roadway planning and ensures that transportation plans do not delay attainment of the National Ambient Air Quality standard. The emissions of transportation plans must conform to the emission budgets from the Air Quality State Implementation plan. The latest approved emission budgets:

Ms. Lubertino told the Council that the Regional Transportation Plan must be updated every 4 years. The 2045 RTP Update and amendments to 2023-2026 TIP must conform to certain requirements. Ms. Lubertino described the requirements, calculations, and draft air quality conformity results to the Council.

Ms. Anita Hollmann-Matijcio, H-GAC, gave a presentation on the 2045 Regional Transportation Plan (RTP) update. Ms. Hollmann-Matijcio proceeded to let the Council know that they are in the process the RTP update and described the completion of two phases of the update. The first phase was the Visioning phase which was completed in July 2022, the second phase was Prioritization and was completed in December 2022 and are now in the Public Review phase and will be completed in April 2022. She also described what Public Outreach had occurred as well as various activities and outreach strategy. A comment, question, answer period occurred after the presentation.

ITEM 10. UPDATE ON PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION AGENCY SAFETY PLAN MEASURES

Ms. Jamila Owens, H-GAC, provided a presentation on Public Transportation Agency Safety Measures. Transit agencies who receive federal funding are required by the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) to develop a safety plan. Transit agencies develop these performance measures to ensure that transit is safe for the employees and their riders. As the MPO, we coordinate with transit providers to analyze data and form draft recommendations for regional measures. We are required to submit the recommendations by April 2023. The The plans track over two tiers of agencies according to their size. Tier I (by size) and Tier 2 (all others.) The plan also tracks four safety categories (fatality, injuries, safety event, and mean distance between failures (revenue vehicles.) Ms. Owens described suggested Tier 1 and Tier 2 performance measures and the timeline for approval by the TPC in April. Comments, questions and answers occurred after this presentation.

ITEM 11. METRORAPID INNER KATY PROJECT UPDATE, JAMILA OWENS, H-GAC AND MS. AMMAH COBBINAH, METRO

Ms. Jamila Owens, H-GAC, introduced Ms. Amma Cobbinah, METRO, who provided a presentation on the METRORapid Inner Katy Project and is one of the new rapid transit corridors identified in the METRONext Plan. Funding was received through the H-GAC 2018 TIP call for projects. It was evaluated as the top project in the TIP and was recognized as a high priority and regionally significant project by the TPC. Ms. Cobbinah gave an overview of the numerous forecasted benefits of the project and the project development process and also said the project is currently in the Conceptual engineering phase. Ms. Cobbinah described additional stations that have been added to the project. Ms. Cobbinah described a safety assessment conducted by METRO, the dedicated transitway for BRT/Regional Express, accommodation of North Houston Highway Improvement Project (NHHIP), coordination of TxDOT's White Oak Bayou Project, ongoing coordination of TxDOT's proposed 1-10 Inner Katy Managed/HOV Lanes project. Ms. Cobinnah concluded her presentation with a timeline of the project and the next steps for the METRORapid Inner Katy Project. Comments, questions and answers occurred after the presentation.
