## 5. MINUTES OF THE TRANSPORTATION POLICY COUNCIL FOR THE HOUSTON-GALVESTON TRANSPORTATION MANAGEMENT AREA SPECIAL MEETING

DATE: Friday, February 4, 2022

# ITEM 7. AMENDMENTS TO THE 2021-2024 TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM (TIP) AND THE 2045 REGIONAL TRANSPORTATION PLAN (RTP), JIM DICKINSON, H-GAC

Mr. Jim Dickinson, H-GAC, presented an amendment to the 2021-2024 TIP and 2045 RTP. The amendment is as follows:

Delay the City of Houston's Fondren Road reconstruction project (MPO ID 17093/CSJ 0912-72-381) from FY 2022 to FY 2024 at TxDOT's request to conform with their 2-year letting schedule. (Total Cost: \$25.5M)

Mr. Dickinson requested TPC approval of Resolution No. 2022-1.

Mr. Beckom described maps that illustrated the Urban and Rural Boundaries and described the adjustments that were made. Mr. Beckom described the TAC recommendations and requested approval from the TPC.

A motion was made by Mayor Joe Zimmerman and seconded to table the item to the next TPC meeting, until the detailed selection criteria for this item are developed and reviewed by TAC. The Council voted and approved the motion.

# ITEM 9. TRANSPORTATION SAFETY PERFORMANCE MEASURES AND TARGETS UPDATE, DAVID FINK, H-GAC.

Mr. David Fink provided an update about Transportation Safety Performance Measures and Targets. The Federal Highway Administration requires an annual submission of safety performance measure targets by the State Department of Transportation and Metropolitan Planning Organizations. The five federal safety performance measures are listed below:

- 1. Number of fatalities
- 2. Number of serious injuries
- 3. Rate of fatalities (per 100 Million Vehicle Miles Traveled)
- 4. Rate of serious injuries (per 100 Million Vehicle Miles Traveled)
- 5. Number of non-motorist fatalities and serious injuries (pedestrians and bicyclist).

Mr. Fink also described tables with Safety Performance Measures and Targets as well as a list of Safety Initiatives implemented by the Metropolitan Planning Organization.

It also assesses needs, gaps and opportunities for increased efficiencies and provides recommendations for improvements. The update offered recommendations for improving mobility in the region. The recommendations were organized around four key themes that grew out of the analyses done for the RCTP update, and the project's public outreach process that are new to the 2022 plan update.
