



#### Why are we doing this?

#### The Big Picture

Many of you were involved in the development of the Downtown Master Plan. This plan, which was adopted by the Bryan City Council in October 2001. recommended significant streetscape and infrastructure improvements in the core of Downtown. The phasing of these improvements was based on the principle of "Concentrating limited financial resources within a targeted area having the greatest potential to become physically enhanced and economically vibrant"

Phase Two of the Implementation of the Master Plan will provide new underground utilities, streets, sidewalks, historic lighting, and landscaping for a four block stretch of Bryan Avenue from 28th to 24th Streets. Improvements to the utilities will accommodate the future needs of our growing businesses. Improved street alignments will provide attractive and pedestrian-friendly intersections. Parking will be provided in a more efficient manner. New and wider sidewalks will be made of concrete with brick accents, and pedestrian scaled streetlights and street furniture will feature a historic character

Construction for Phase Two is to begin in July 2006, at an estimated cost of \$7,200,000. The construction should be completed within eighteen months, depending on the weather. Construction workers will ensure that the stores are accessible during business hours with the only exception being the day sidewalks are replaced directly adjacent to the front door of the business.

Progress always causes some inconveniences, but the City of Bryan will work with merchants and property owners to ensure as painless a process as possible. Please feel free to call us with any concerns. If ever there was a time for members of our business community to rally together, to communicate and work cooperatively, that time is now. It will be worth it!

#### **Project Phasing**

- Unlike Main Street construction, Bryan Avenue will be constructed in 1/2 sections, block by block.
- Construction will generally begin at 24th Street and progress south toward 28th street along the western side of Bryan Avenue. During this phase the eastern side of Bryan Avenue will be converted to one-way traffic flow (traveling north) and detour signs appropriately placed. On-street parking will remain on the eastern side of Bryan Avenue
- Upon reaching 28th Street, construction will begin on the eastern side of Bryan Avenue and proceed north from 28th Street back to 24th Street. During this phase, on-street parking will be available on the western side of Bryan Avenue and traffic flow will be one way (traveling south) on the western side of Bryan Avenue.
- This work will progress with up to 3 blocks under construction at any one time. Demolition work will be underway on one block, while utilities are being installed on another block, while final concrete paving is installed on a third block. There certainly may be less blocks of Bryan Avenue under construction at one time but no more than 3.
- Side streets from Main to Parker Avenue within the project limits will be constructed at the contractor's schedule. There may be side street construction underway while Bryan Avenue is under construction but it would have to be done in a way that wouldn't affect detour routes.
- Due to the nature of rehabilitation projects, the project phasing may vary. The City of Bryan staff will make every effort to keep you informed on construction progress and changes in schedule.


