

## **SH 6 ACCESS MANAGEMENT STUDY**

### **Background**

The Houston-Galveston Area Council (H-GAC) is conducting a study regarding transportation improvements to the southern section of State Highway 6 from FM 521 to IH 45 South. The SH 6 South Access Management Study area encompasses the communities of Arcola, Alvin, Manvel, Santa Fe, Hitchcock and Bayou Vista, and Fort Bend, Brazoria and Galveston Counties. The study is seeking solutions to reduce crashes, improve traffic flow, and minimize motorist delay.

An important aspect of the project is actively engaging the public. The Southern SH 6 Segment Access Management Study public participation activities provide an ongoing information exchange from the beginning to the end of the study. Arriving at consensus on the short- and long-range alternatives during the study process will enable the next phase of programming improvements and design to focus on implementation details rather than big-picture issues. This section describes the various public participation activities and techniques that were used during the development of the study.

### **Current Situation**

The project team has developed proposed design alternatives for intersections along the corridor. The project team has also developed a toolbox of median treatments in addition to a livable center matrix and land use map. The third and final round of public meetings will be held in late August.
