

Livable Centers, 10 Year Evaluation and Summary

Background

Livable Centers are places where people can live, work, and play with less reliance on their cars. The Livable Centers Program (Program) works with local communities to reimagine auto-focused infrastructure, policies, and programs to be more multi-modal friendly and encourage the development of Livable Centers. The first Livable Centers study was completed in 2009, and today 28 studies are on the path to implementation in the region's rural, suburban, and urban communities.

The Livable Centers, 10 Year Evaluation and Summary is a celebration of the Program and recognizes local partners' commitment to plan, develop, negotiate and implement study recommendations. Findings are based on local sponsor feedback received in the Fall of 2018 and identify study implementation status as it pertains to projects, policies and programs.
