Chair Kenneth Clark called the Transportation Policy Council (TPC) to order at 9:30a.m.

ITEM 1. CERTIFICATION OF QUORUM

ITEM 4. APPROVAL OF FRIDAY, MARCH 26, 2021 MEETING MINUTES SUMMARY

Secretary Grady Prestage presented the March 26, 2021 Meeting Minutes summary to the Council. Secretary Prestage asked the Council for any modifications or corrections as presented. There were none.

Council Member David Robinson made a motion for approval of the March 26, 2021 meeting minutes and was seconded by Chuck Wemple. The Council voted and approved the minutes summary.

ITEM 5. APPROVAL OF CONGESTION MANAGEMENT PROCESS (CMP), ALAN RODENSTEIN, H-GAC

Mr. Alan Rodenstein, H-GAC gave a presentation on the Congestion Management Process (CMP) and explained the CMP is an ongoing process designed to address congestion in the Houston-Galveston Transportation Management area. It is a requirement of the Federal Highway Administration and is required for certification as a Metropolitan Planning Organization. Mr. Rodenstein proceeded to describe the basic elements of the CMP process are to identify regional congestion and its causes, apply a variety of mitigation strategies designed to improve the system, and evaluate strategies' effectiveness and make necessary adjustments.

Mr. Rodenstein briefed the Council on the 45-day Public Comment process from November 22, 2020 to January 7, 2021. A public meeting was held online December 3, 2020 with 5 questions and comments received. Seventy-three (73) comments were received from groups and individuals. All comments can be seen on the website.

Mr. Rodenstein finished his presentation by describing changes made to the CMP based on the comments received. The CMP update will be submitted to Federal Highway Administration in late Spring. A future more extensive update was planned to be conducted as a next phase of revision to this document.

A motion was made by Dr. Carol Lewis and seconded by Council Member David Robinson.

The Council voted and approved Resolution 2021-12.

Changes to the regional transportation plan will be categorized as either an Administrative Modification or a TPC Amendment (Level 1 or Level 2). He provided a flowchart that illustrated his presentation. Mr. Beckom finished his presentation by giving a timeline for these amendments and the expected outcome of a comprehensive amendment process.

A motion was made by Council Member David Robinson and seconded by Mayor Emeritus Tom Reid.

The Council voted and the motion was approved.

- Remove federal Congestion Mitigation/Air Quality (CMAQ) funding, as well as the state matching funds, and replace them with local funding for the SH 99 (Grand Parkway) overpass construction project at Peek Road (MPO ID 18032/CSJ 0912-72-381) at the request of Fort Bend County.
- Modify the scope of work of the City of Houston Fondren Road six-lane widening project (MPO ID 17093/CSJ 3510-04-049) to a reconstruction of the existing four lanes with intersection, safety, multimodal, and drainage improvements at the City's request.
- C. Planning Activities Report

Mr. Craig Raborn, H-GAC, updated the Council on the H-GAC's call for planning study sponsors for the Livable Centers Program, Rebuilding American Infrastructure with Sustainability and Equity (RAISE) Program, a letter from the Texas Department of Transportation regarding lapsing Federal funds for Congestion Management and Air Quality (CMAQ) and the re-convening of the Project Prioritization Workgroup.
