Call for Projects - Overview

- Eligible Sponsors
 - Agencies within 8-County MPA
 - TxDOT- HOU & BEA Districts
 - City and County governments
 - Transit Agencies
 - Ports
 - Special District w/Local Govt Support





Call for Projects – Projects requirements

- All proposed projects requesting federal funds must be consistent the regional vision and goals established in the 2045 Regional Transportation Plan
- Total project cost for active transportation projects must be greater than \$150,000
- Total project cost for roadway/freight or transit projects must be greater than \$500,000
- All proposed projects requesting federal funds must provide project budget including all phases Right of Way acquisition, Engineering, utility relocation and Construction in (2021 \$ value)



Call for Projects – Projects requirements

- All submitted projects must include local match funding commitment letter
- All sponsors requesting transportation development credits (TDCs) for eligible projects must submit TDC application
- Adjoining projects that cross jurisdictional boundaries must be submitted as one corridor
- Projects submitted for consideration of RTP need not submit benefits calculation templates all other project submittals must include required calculation templates



Call for Projects – Overview

- Call for projects for
 - Short-range: Begin construction within next 5 years (up to FY 2027)
 - Medium-range: Begin construction within next 6-10 years (2028-2032)
 - Predevelopment for RTP (long-range projects)
- Application process in two phases
 - Phase 1 (Pre-application online) (30 days submission period)
 - Screening criteria for consistency with regional vision (RTP)
 - Project information & readiness (project development) criteria
 - Budget
 - Phase 2 (Application online) (45 days submission period)
 - Benefits calculation templates
 - Planning factors



Call for Projects - Overview

- Projects with completed project development phases or soon to be completed and are consistent with regional vision will be considered as a short-range projects
- Projects consistent with regional vision and have not begun project development phase will be considered medium range projects
- Sponsors may request federal funds for all project phases. Projects that are scheduled to begin construction in medium range may request project development phases to be scheduled in short range.
- Long range projects (FY > 2032) that did not complete pre-planning will advance to project predevelopment planning

 - Status, expected completion



Budget template

- If sponsors intend to use TDCs as local match TDC application must be submitted
- Local match funding commitment letter must be provided

Investment Categories



Call for Projects – Investment Categories

- Major Investments
- Expand
- Manage
- Maintain
- Active Transportation



Major investments: All roadway, freight or transit projects that have a total project cost of \$100M or more. Total project cost (federal+match) will include all phases (including Engineering, Environmental, ROW, Utility and Construction).



- Expand: All roadway, freight or transit projects that expand the network capacities.
 - Example projects New roadway construction, road widening, expansion of managed lanes, expansion of Transit
- Manage: All roadway, freight or transit projects that improve operations of existing networks.
 - Example projects Access management, grade separations (including atgrade railroad crossings), intersection improvements, ITS expansion/upgrade projects



- Maintain: All roadway, freight or transit projects that extend the useful life of the existing networks or improve resiliency of the existing networks.
 - Example projects Roadway reconstruction and rehabilitation projects, transit facility reconstruction
- Active Transportation: All projects that expand, manage or maintain bicycle and pedestrian infrastructure that provide alternative choices to essential trip making.
 - Example projects All bike/pedestrian infrastructure including bike/ped expansion, new bike/ped infrastructure, reconstruction and infrastructure upgrades, bike/ped bridge projects.



- Any roadway project that includes expansion of through lanes must be submitted as expand investment category project.
- Complete streets or road diet projects that do not include reconstruction of roadway or other roadway improvements can be submitted as active transportation investment category project.
- Bicycle pedestrian corridor projects that include intersection crossing improvements can be submitted as active transportation investment category project.

 Split scoring with Benefit-Cost Analysis and Planning Factors



Scoring — Maj.Invest., Expand, Manage, Maintain

B/C Analysis (100 pts)

Safety – 50% (50 pts)

Delay Reduction - 30% (30 pts)

Emissions Benefit – 20% (20 pts)

Planning Factors (100 pts)

Total Score (200 pts)

B/C Analysis – 50% (100 pts)

Planning Factors – 50% (100 pts)



Scoring - Active Transportation

B/C Analysis (40 pts)

Safety – 50% (20 pts)

B/C Analysis – 20% (40 pts)



TAC Recommendation



- Create Rural Funding Allocation
 - Use an established urbanized area boundary
 - Percentage of total available funds
- Determine Allocation percentage
 - Base on previous TPC action (2019 CFP)
 - 9% of federal funds to projects in rural area
 - "Floor" rather than "Cap"
- Relative scoring for rural projects (conditional)
- Projects must meet minimum required points
 - Threshold TBD (assessing scoring with sample projects)
- Provide opportunity for each local agency to assign additional points to one or more high priority project (details TBD)

Rural Allocation – Additional Issues

- Option One: Separate Rural Ranking Process (Staff Recommendation)
 - Planning Criteria scores for rural projects different from urban projects
 - Total scores (planning factors score + B/C ratio score) of rural projects submitted in an investment category are ranked in descending order (Urban projects follow separate process)
 - Projects selected in descending order until 9% allocation met
- Option Two: Combined Rural and Urban Ranking Process
 - Planning Criteria scores for rural and urban projects are same
 - Total scores (planning factors score + B/C ratio score) of rural and urban projects submitted in an investment category are ranked in descending order
 - Rural projects selected in descending order until 9% allocation met; urban projects passed over as needed
- 9 percent exceeded to select whole projects

Hypothetical Values

- Funding Target (9%)
 - \$9,000,000
- Minimum Score:
 - 50 points

Issue:

- Rural projects selected over Urban projects with higher scores
- Rural projects will generally score lower

Rural Allocation – Remaining (TBD) Issues Discussion

- Minimum Scoring Threshold:
 - Following TPC adoption of Rural Allocation (including Ranking Process), staff will test current scoring process (and leading alternatives, if any) on 2018 CFP submittals
 - Staff will assess and make recommendation for minimum score (TAC/TPC action)
 - Only projects scoring higher than minimum will be eligible for selection
- High Priority Project Points (AKA "Bonus Points") assignable by jurisdictions
 - Probably 3 to 8 points; sufficient to shift approx. one priority project per jurisdiction
 - Set maximum points assignable to individual projects (minimum point threshold possible)
 - Distribution alternatives:
 - Equal points to all jurisdictions
 - Proportional distribution of allocable points (population) to all TPC jurisdictions or members
 - Hybrid formula (e.g., all counties get X points; all TPC jurisdictions/members get X Proportional points)
 - Staff recommendation after Planning Factors Scoring Process settled (TAC/TPC action)
