


Urban/Suburban/Rural Criteria - Purpose

- Create a geographic equity planning factor in project selection criteria
 - Address perceived geographic inequity in 2018 CFP selection
- Multiple options considered
 - Use accepted urbanized area boundary to differentiate between urban and rural projects and provide points
 - Policy decision to create Urban/Rural Set-Aside based on accepted urbanized area boundary

Urban/Suburban/Rural Areas

- Urban/Suburban/Rural- Planning factors criteria presented last month
- Activity Population Density
 - Rural area 0 0.4
 - Suburban area 0.41- 0.8
 - Urban area 0.81-1.0



Options Considered

- 1. Use activity population density to differentiate high, medium and low-density areas.
 - Create geographic equity planning factors criteria and provide high points to low density areas, medium points to medium density areas, and no points to high density areas.
- 2. Use accepted urbanized area boundary (census or Adjusted) to differentiate urban, rural projects
 - Create geographic equity planning factors criteria and provide points to projects located in the rural areas




Options Considered

Staff Recommendation

- 4. Based on accepted urbanized (census or Adjusted) area boundary create Urban/Rural Set-Aside percentages out of total available funds (Policy decision)
 - Rural projects will compete with other rural projects
 - Urban projects will compete with other urban projects
 - Within urbanized area create geographic equity planning factors criteria and provide higher points to areas outside of BW and within urbanized area (suburban)



Comments since last meeting

- If selected for construction funding, projects that require Army Corps of Engineers permits and Railroad agreements may be programmed in years 4 and 5 of the 10-year plan at the earliest
- If selected for construction funding, projects should have utility coordination underway utility relocation may continue after the project is let
- If selected, projects that trigger air quality conformity will be programmed after the next Transportation Conformity determination
- Change jurisdiction support to jurisdictional coordination
