We have determined that the Houston-Galveston Area Council (H-GAC) 2035 Regional Transportation Plan (RTP) and FY 2008-2011 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) meet all requirements for making a joint conformity determination to the eight-hour ozone standard under the Clean Air Act Amendments of 1990. This MTP and TIP conformity determination and the procedures used to make this determination are in accordance with the provisions of the transportation conformity rule (40 CFR Parts 51 and 93) dated August 15, 1997, as amended.

The Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) acts as executive agent for the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) on Plan and TIP air quality conformity determinations. Accordingly, this letter will serve as the joint FHWA/FTA conformity determination.
