Hurricane Preparation Week: Now through May 6

Hurricane Season begins June 1, making now a great time to make a plan, build your kit, and know where to go and how you'll get there during an evacuation. H-GAC offers instructions and preparedness documents, including a comprehensive zip-zone map created with the collaboration of our partnering counties and communities, showing evacuation areas by zip code and evacuation pathways for residents in those areas.

2023 Trash Bash:

More than 40 tons of trash removed from our waterways

Nearly 2,500 volunteers came together on March 25 to clean more than 108 miles of shoreline at this year's River, Lakes, Bays, N' Bayous Trash Bash_®. Volunteers where spread across 14 locations collecting 40.51 tons of trash, 0.38 tons of recyclables, and 219 illegally dumped tires. Afterwards, volunteers enjoyed picnics and educational exhibits and games at each of the 14 locations to learn about the common sources of water pollution.

Since the inception of the annual event in 1994, more than 119,000 volunteers have removed 2,451 tons of trash and 12,184 tires from waterways in the Galveston Bay watershed. H-GAC Hosts First Regional Broadband Summit

H-GAC recently hosted a Broadband Summit bringing together local elected and appointed officials, various engineering firms and internet service providers, and stakeholders to learn about expanding broadband access. During the height of the recent pandemic, when students were required to attend school remotely, the impact of the broadband divide was underscored by access to education and instruction, and resulting learning loss.

At the Broad Band Summit, attendees learned about opportunities to help expand broadband connectivity and promote digital inclusion through presentations, discussions, and best practices shared by the Federal Communications Commission, the National Telecommunications & Information Administration, and the Texas Broadband Development Office.

Using lessons learned and information shared at the conference, H-GAC is creating a strategy to continue its work to help local governments and communities bridge the great broadband divide.

Brazoria County Leaders Discuss their County and Communities with H-GAC

Brazoria County identified top three shared concerns:

- Railroads, with particular emphasis on blocked crossings for extended periods of time
- · Mental heath and access to care
- Drainage infrastructure related to flooding and new development


