# 6. AMENDMENTS TO THE 2025-2028 TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM AND THE 2045 REGIONAL TRANSPORTATION PLAN

#### BACKGROUND

The 2025-2028 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) is a four-year capital improvements program for transportation projects. Under federal rules, all federally assisted projects must be included in the TIP to be eligible for funding. In addition, federal rules require that regionally significant local projects must also be included in the TIP.

The 2045 Regional Transportation Plan (RTP) is a long-range plan that prioritizes spending on regional transportation projects including short and long-range strategies to ensure the transportation network is safe and efficient. Updated every four years, the RTP outlines a fiscally constrained transportation investment program that is based on the unique needs and characteristics of the MPO region.

Amendments to the TIP and RTP are brought to the Transportation Policy Council for consideration monthly and amended in accordance with the H-GAC Public Participation Plan.

#### CURRENT SITUATION

A summary of the proposed revisions to the 2025-2028 Transportation Improvement Program is included below.

- Cancel two Fort Bend County locally funded, non-regionally significant widening projects on Harlem Road and Beechnut Street (MPO IDs 12622 and 13754) at the County's request.
- Add the FY 2023 \$1.6M Congressional Community Project Funding award to the City of Pearland's Mykawa Road widening project (MPO ID 17082) which will be matched with \$400K of local funding.
- Add the FY 2024 \$850K Congressional Community Project Funding award to Westchase Management District's Meadowglen West sidewalk reconstruction project (MPO ID 18098) which will be matched with \$213K of local funding.
- Add the engineering phase to the TxDOT Beaumont District's FY 2025 US 90 widening project (MPO ID 16347) funded with additional Cat-4, Cat-12 and Cat-12CL funding.
- Add the engineering phase to the TxDOT Beaumont District's FY 2025 FM 565 widening project (MPO ID 17113) funded with additional Cat-2 funding.
- Add Congestion Mitigation/Air Quality (CMAQ) funding to the TxDOT Beaumont District's FY 2023 SH 105 widening project (MPO ID 18031) to cover a cost overrun.
- Add CMAQ funding to the TxDOT Beaumont District's FY 2025 US 90 grade separation construction project at Union Pacific Railroad (MPO ID 18036) to cover a cost overrun.

- Add CMAQ funding to the TxDOT Beaumont District's FY 2026 US 90 grade separation construction project at FM 1413 (MPO ID 19187) to cover a cost overrun.
- Split Montgomery County's FY 2025 Congressional Community Project funded Ford Road widening project (MPO ID 18120) into two sections creating a locally funded section from IH 69 to Needham Road in FY 2026 (MPO ID 19413). Delay the original section (MPO ID 18120) to FY 2026 with reduced local funding.
- Delay two Port of Houston Authority Port Road grade separation project phases (engineering: MPO ID 19012; construction: MPO ID 19013) to FY 2027 and FY 2028 at the Port's request to coordinate with the construction of the Bayport Southern Access Road.
- Increase the Surface Transportation/Block Grant funding, with Transportation Development Credits (TDCs) in lieu of matching funds, on Chambers County's Hatcherville Road reconstruction project (MPO ID 19078) to cover expected construction cost increases based on the latest estimate.
- Adjust the Federal Transit Administration Section 5307 Urban Area formula funding and replace the state and local matching funds with TDCs, for the City of Galveston's transit planning and operating project (MPO ID 19088) at the City's request.
- + Program METRO's Police Department Headquarters building site purchase and rehabilitation project (MPO ID 19539) with \$50M of local funding in FY 2026 at METRO's request.
- + Program METRO's Eastwood Transit Center Reconstruction project (MPO ID 19540) with \$29M of local funding in FY 2027 at METRO's request.

#### ACTION REQUESTED

Transportation Advisory Committee recommendation for Transportation Policy Council approval of Resolutions 2025-18 and 2025-19.





AUTHORIZING AMENDMENTS OF THE 2025-2028 TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM (TIP) AND THE 2045 REGIONAL TRANSPORTATION PLAN (RTP) FOR THE HOUSTON-GALVESTON METROPOLITAN PLANNING AREA

WHEREAS, the 2045 Regional Transportation Plan was adopted by the Transportation Policy Council on May 19, 2023; and

WHEREAS, the 2025-2028 Transportation Improvement Program for the Houston-Galveston Metropolitan Planning Area was adopted by the Transportation Policy Council on June 28, 2024; and

WHEREAS, the proposed revisions to the 2025-2028 Transportation Improvement Program are consistent with the 2045 Regional Transportation Plan and its finding of conformance with the State Implementation Plan for air quality; and

WHEREAS, the proposed revisions to the 2025-2028 Transportation Improvement Program are consistent with the federal fiscal constraint requirements established for the Transportation Improvement Program and are consistent with the financially constrained 2045 Regional Transportation Plan.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE TRANSPORTATION POLICY COUNCIL (TPC) FOR THE HOUSTON-GALVESTON METROPOLITAN PLANNING AREA THAT THE 2025–2028 TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM AND THE 2045 REGIONAL TRANSPORTATION PLAN BE AMENDED TO REFLECT THE REVISIONS IDENTIFIED IN THE TABLE OF **JULY 2025 TPC AMENDMENTS**.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT FEDERAL FUNDS AUTHORIZED BY THE TPC FROM THE CONGESTION MITIGATION AND AIR QUALITY (CMAQ) AND SURFACE TRANSPORTATION BLOCK GRANT (STBG) PROGRAMS REPRESENT A LIMITING AMOUNT. ANY COST OVERRUNS ON PHASES OF WORK AUTHORIZED BY THE TPC OR COSTS INCURRED ON PHASES OF WORK NOT AUTHORIZED BY THE TPC SHALL BE THE RESPONSIBILITY OF THE PROJECT SPONSOR. IN NO CASE, SHALL FEDERAL PARTICIPATION UNDER THE CMAQ AND STBG PROGRAMS BE INCREASED WITHOUT CONSULTATION AND THE EXPRESS APPROVAL OF THE TPC.

WHEREAS, the Houston-Galveston Area Council has established a documented process for the evaluation of applications and the award of credits; and

WHEREAS, the Houston-Galveston Area Council is in receipt of requests for credits; and

WHEREAS, the award of credits for these purposes is consistent with the Policy governing the consideration of requests for credits adopted by the Policy Council on November 20, 2020.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE TRANSPORTATION POLICY COUNCIL (TPC) FOR THE HOUSTON-GALVESTON METROPOLITAN PLANNING AREA THAT TRANSPORTATION DEVELOPMENT CREDITS BE MADE AVAILABLE TO THE PROJECTS IN THE ATTACHED TABLE#1 AND THAT THE TRANSPORTATION DIRECTOR IS DIRECTED TO ENTER INTO ANY NECESSARY PROJECT AGREEMENTS.

#### Proposed McGowen MPD Headquarters Project Description

#### June 25, 2025

The Metropolitan Transit Authority of Harris County (METRO) proposes to renovate and repurpose an existing commercial property—formerly the Cadillac Car Dealership—into the new headquarters for the METRO Police Department (MPD). The project will support the consolidation and modernization of MPD operations in a centralized facility designed to meet current and future transit security and emergency response needs.

#### **Support of Regional Transportation Goals**

As the first goal expressed in the Regional Transportation Plan, Safety is the METRO's police department (MPD) mission. It is dedicated to providing a safe travel experience for all METRO patrons as well as travelers sharing the streets and highways used by METRO's passengers and vehicles. MPD's current headquarters will be lost due to its location within the future path of the North Canal flood control project. This project is one of the primary strategies designed to reduce flood risk at the confluence of White Oak and Buffalo Bayous by creating a new, straighter channel for the water from these two Bayous. The proposed location for the new channel will require the demolition of MPD's headquarters current facility.

#### **Property Description**

The property addresses are 2520 Main Street and 801 McGowen Street. Situated directly along METRO's Red Line and adjacent to an existing McGowen Station, the site provides excellent transit accessibility for both staff and the public. The site is also located near several major freeways, including I-10, I-45, I-69, and SH 288, offering excellent regional connectivity. This convenient access to the freeway network is ideal for METRO Police Department operations, enabling officers to efficiently reach various parts of the service area and respond quickly to incidents across the METRO service area. Its current site configuration requires no modification to entrances or exits, supporting efficient vehicle circulation and access without additional infrastructure investment.

#### Proposed Project Scope

The renovated facility will serve as the primary operations hub for approximately 200 officers and staff, supporting the safe and efficient operation of METRO's transit services throughout the METRO service area. The site will be designed to include the full range of functional components necessary for a modern transit police department headquarters.

#### **NEPA Environmental Clearance**

After consulting with FTA, METRO will conduct a Categorical Exclusion in accordance with the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) and FTA environmental requirements (49 CFR Part 622 and 23 CFR Part 771) to support the property acquisition and facility redevelopment. METRO anticipates completing the property acquisition by the end of calendar year 2025. The environmental review and due diligence processes are currently underway to support this timeline and ensure the project is eligible for future federal funding opportunities.

After the FTA clearance is received, METRO will request Letter of No Prejudice (LONP) to proceed with preliminary activities such as design, site preparation, and other eligible work necessary to maintain the project schedule prior to grant award. This project aligns with FTA priorities by enhancing the safety, security, and resilience of public transit infrastructure while supporting the long-term operational effectiveness of the METRO Police Department.

#### **Eastwood Transit Center Reconstruction**

Maintaining its assets in State of Good Repair is both a primary goal of the Metropolitan Transit Authority and the Regional Transportation Plan. METRO's Eastwood Transit Center needs rehabilitation, reconstruction and reconfiguration as necessary, of the facility including its canopy, amenities such as benches, trash receptacles, announcement boards, and signage as well as enhanced landscaping, repaving, curb repair and ADA compliance work throughout the site and at the adjoining parking lots. Security upgrades are also planned for the site. The full detailed scope of the rehabilitation is to be determined through concept development and coordination with all departments. The goals of the rehabilitation are to:

- 1. **Bring the facility to a State of Good Repair.** The site is currently deemed as Marginal, where there are deteriorated components in need of replacements. This is to be accomplished by replacing the aging canopy which is showing signs of rust at critical points in the structure (to be determined through a full structural review). Replacing the amenities such as the metal benches which also have rust and pieces sticking out. Fixing some of the gates, irrigation systems and storm drains that are currently damaged.
- 2. **Strengthen Safety and Security.** Eastwood TC is one of the biggest transit centers in the system with 11 total bays and one of the busiest TC as well. Currently the site only has one camera which is at the mobile ridestore which is currently in place as part of the changeover to the new METRO fare system. This camera only covers the employee entrance and does not cover the whole site. As part of METRONow, safety is a primary component and as such, METRO is working to have full coverage at all METRO facilities. Additional cameras will need to be added to the facility for full site coverage.
- 3. **Improve access to the site for all.** Currently, the site is not ADA compliant, the ramps and curbs are severely damaged and not clearly marked. Access from the adjoining parking lots are not clearly indicated with pedestrian crosswalks and are unprotected. Full ADA compliance and pedestrian safety improvements are needed throughout the site and in the adjoining parking lots. For customers who park, the parking lots need to be repaved and restriped.
- 4. Enhance the customer waiting experience. All the amenities benches, trash receptacles, announcement boards, and signage are in need of updates. As the transit center is quite big, wayfinding and a general area for transit information with digital signage is being proposed to help customers know where their buses are at. The several announcement boards are no longer useable as they have either deteriorated or aren't secured. The landscaping in the central courtyard of the transit center is severely deteriorated.
