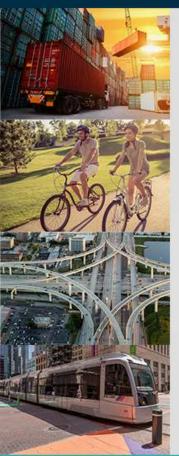

- Phase I
 - Announcement December 2023
 - Evaluation Criteria Published December 2023
 - Evaluation Criteria Questionnaires December 2023
 - Criteria Responses submitted January March 2024
 - Criteria Scoring March June 2024
 - Criteria Scores Validation June July 2024
- Projects scored > 50 points advance to Phase II



Selection Process Steps

Phase II

- Benefit-Cost Analysis July August 2024
- Benefit-Cost Analysis review September 2024
- Validation on Benefit-Cost rations September/October 2024
- Benefit-Cost ratios converted to 0-100 points scale October 2024
- Combined BCA scores with criteria scores, sorted projects from high to low scores and ranked them in each category
- Published draft rankings of projects in each category



Selection Process Steps

- Assessed project readiness for top scoring projects based on project readiness questionnaire responses - November/December 2024
- Reviewed funding eligibility November/December 2024
- Applied funding instructions November/December 2024
- Previewed staff recommendations with TAC and TPC January 2025

Draft Recommendations

- TxDOT Beaumont District and Local governments projects are recommended for consideration of funding award until the funding instructions are met for each category
- TxDOT Houston District sponsored projects are not recommended due to priority programming approved by TPC in June 2024
- Remaining projects on the draft ranked list of project are recommended for consideration of listing in the RTP
 - Projects listed in the RTP may continue project development and seek federal approvals such as environmental clearance



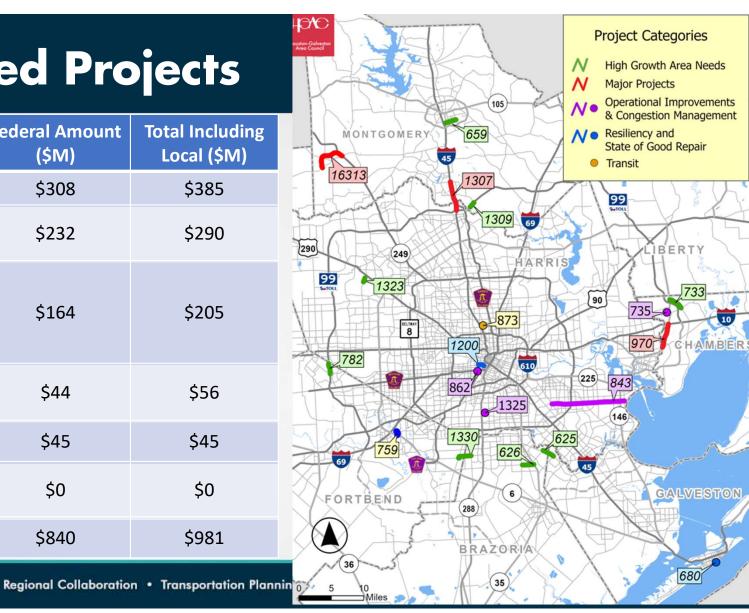

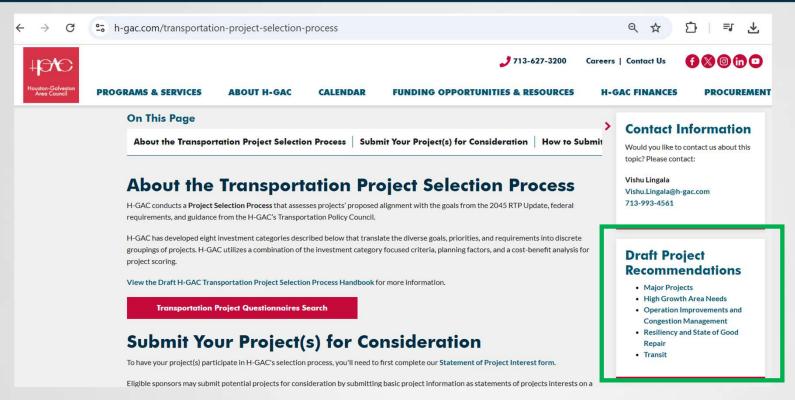

Benefit-Cost Scoring Method

- BCA Scoring Method 3:
 - Projects with BCR > 1.0 were sorted from high to low
 - Projects with a BCR > 10 were assigned 100 points (max)
 - Projects with a BCR from 6.0-10.0 were assigned 75 points
 - Projects with a BCR from 3.0-6.0 were assigned 50 points
 - Projects with a BCR from 1.0-3.0 were assigned 25 points
 - BCR < 1.0 was assigned 0 points (lowest)

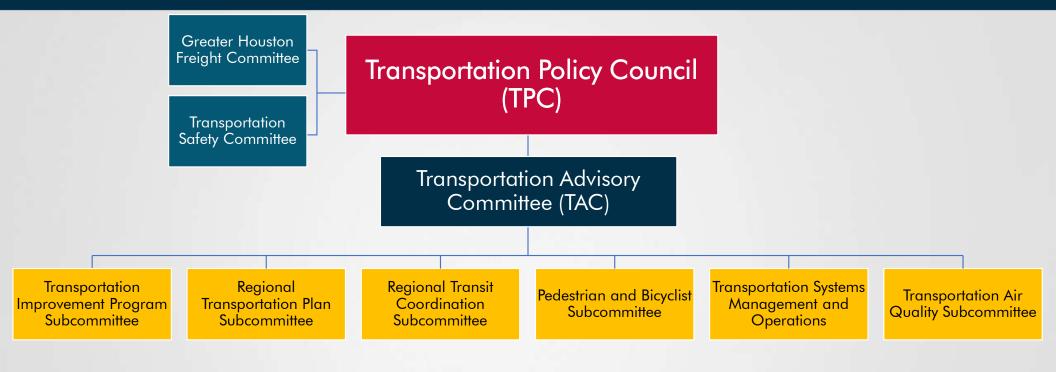

 - Number of non-motorized fatalities and serious injuries



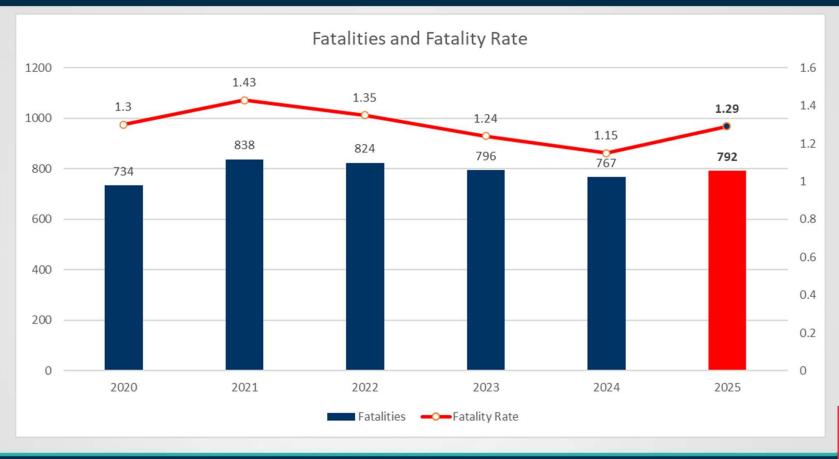

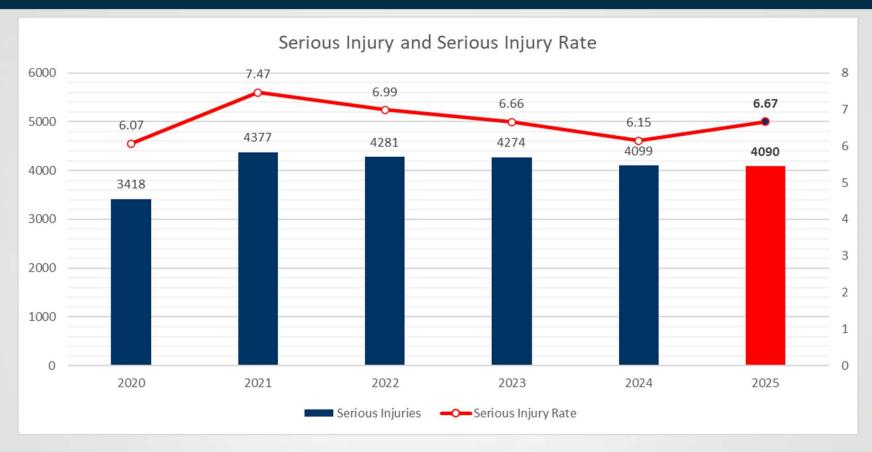

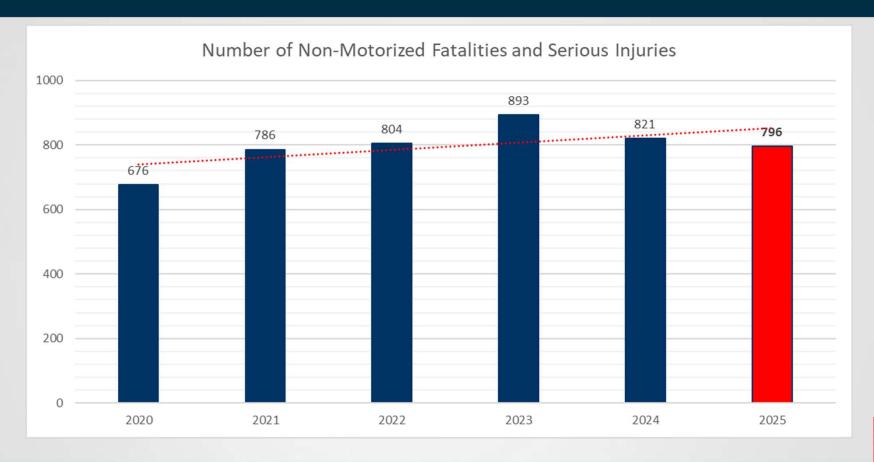

Future 2025-2028 TIP Amendments

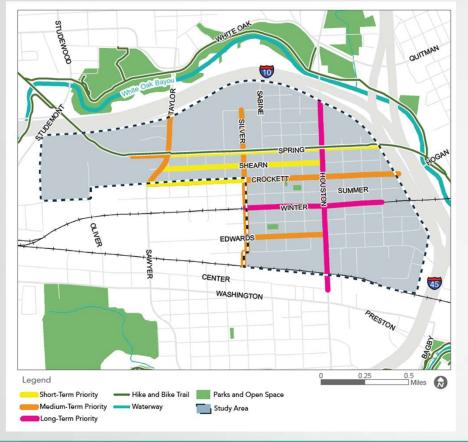

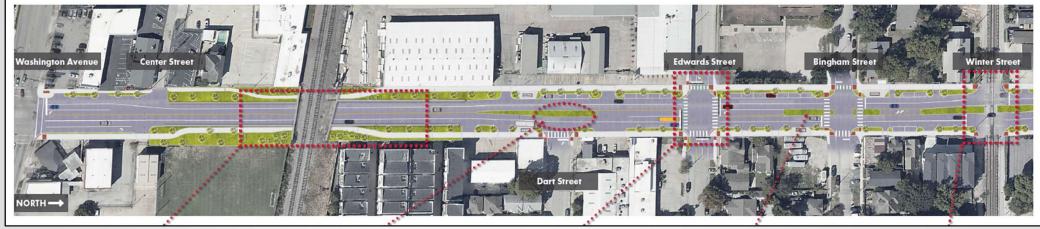

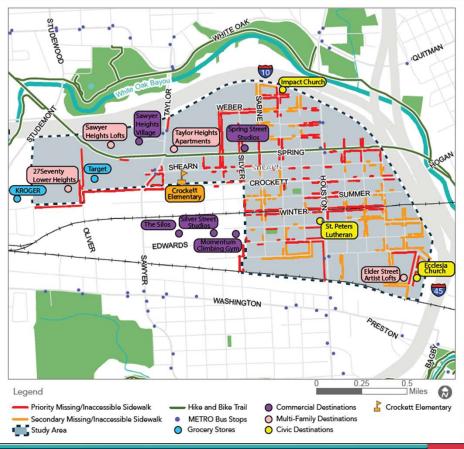
