

GDW Meeting Summary for December 2, 2020

2020 TxGIS Day Recap: Last month from Monday, November 16th to Wednesday, November 18th, the TxGIS Day 2020 virtual GIS Day celebration/conference was held for GIS professionals from across the state of Texas. In addition, the smaller 2020 Houston Area GIS Day, tailored to high-school students, was held as part of the larger statewide event. Janny Phung with URISA Texas and the City of Austin and Nicole Ceranek with Montgomery County, TX gave a brief recap of both events and had the following statistics to share:

- Registrants: 1,068
- Presenters: 149
- Presentations: 30
- Events and Workshops: 11
- VGI Mapathon Submissions: 2,769 buildings digitized for the Humanitarian Open Street Map Team Campaigns
- Mentors for the Career Cupid Speed Mentoring Event: 18
- Partnerships: 7 including Organizations and Universities
- Value to the GIS Community: Priceless

Given the statistics above, the event was a huge success thanks in large part to the months of meetings and behind the scenes work by the planning committee. Esri HTTP to HTTPS Conversion Reminder: Zena Pelletier with Esri gave the GDW a brief update and reminder about the upcoming HTTP to HTTPS conversion for all of Esri's online content, including ArcGIS Online and ArcGIS Enterprise systems. On Tuesday, December 8, 2020 all Esri online content will automatically revert to use HTTPS web addresses exclusively, so any web GIS content hosted on a web enabled Esri platform that hasn't been converted to use only HTTPS will not display properly. Zena made it clear however that the content will not be

deleted or hidden, but that rather it just will not display properly until the content owner has converted their content to use HTTPS only. Zena and Esri have provided these additional resources below to help users prepare for this change coming next week:

2021 Data Axle (formerly Infogroup) Cost-Share Reminder: Brooks Andrews with H-GAC reminded the GDW that the sign-up portal for the 2021 cost-share program to obtain the 2021 Data Axle (formerly Infogroup) business and residential databases is now open and taking registrations until the February 2021. The process to receive the licensed databases starts with registering to participate via the [cost-share portal](#) on the H-GAC GDW website. Once registered, the cost of the final data is split among all registered participants where the participants receive both databases in a few different GIS formats as well as SAS and DBF tables for the 13 H-GAC county region in May 2021.
