

#### Regional Pedestrian & Bicycle Plan Update

- H-GAC is updating the regional bicycle network map
- Advisory Workgroup met in December
  - "Regional Active Transportation Plan"
  - Think about fun branding of the plan, e.g. "Walk.Bike.Thrive!" from ARC
  - Key plan enhancements: pedestrian, policy, equity, data, performance measures
  - Partner surveys and public surveys: simple language (no jargon), match some questions to Houston Bike Plan survey when possible, make surveys easy to do




#### Regional Pedestrian & Bicycle Plan Update
