

Dashboard PSAs Action Planning

Components

- Stationary monitor networks in five focus communities: Galena Park/Jacinto City, Gulfton, Kashmere Gardens, Pasadena, Near Northside.
- Combination of locations: residential homes, community centers, municipal buildings, etc.
- Monitor hosts trained and serve as Air Quality Ambassadors who give air quality presentations.
- Mobile monitoring events ("Sampling the City")
- Supplemental monitors placed throughout the region based on community need/concern
- Direct and indirect support to other community networks (Fort Bend Houston, Port Arthur)





Looking Ahead

- Our real-time dashboard of the regional network and each local network will launch this summer.
- A series of PSA/videos will be produced to educate residents about how to use the dashboard and the data.
- With trend data (~ 3 months), we will begin action planning in each focus community.
- As other communities hear about CAMP, we receive inquiries for joining the program.
 Prioritization and funding will be needed.
- We are also piloting new air technologies to ensure the best return on investment.
