CALL TO ORDER

ITEM 1A. Introductions

Ken Fickes called the meeting to order members and alternates introduced themselves.

ITEM 1B. Approval of Meeting Summary (03-21-2024) Meeting Summary approved.

ACTION ITEMS

ITEM 2A. Reliability Congestion and Air Quality Performance Measures Request for Endorsement-Karen Owen Karen Owen presented federal performance measures focused on the national highway system, including travel reliability, congestion, and air quality. She discussed historical data, targets, and recommendations for future targets, taking into account the impact of COVID-19 and population growth on travel patterns and reliability levels. Karen also presented the draft recommendations for the Transportation Improvement Program and Regional Transportation Plan to the H-GAC subcommittees, seeking their endorsements and feedback.

Transportation Air Quality subcommittee suggested scheduling another meeting in September to allow for further discussion and decision-making.

DISCUSSION

ITEM 3A. Commute Solutions Month-Robyn Egbert, H-GAC

Robyn Egbert discussed Commute Solutions month an Ozone action campaign for the month of September. The goal is to bring awareness to the region on how residents can lower their ozone emissions during the month of September. Different options were discussed for ways to commute. As well as free Fridays on select routes.

ITEM 3B. Rider 7 Introduction-Pharr Andrews, H-GAC

Phar Andrews gave some background on rider 7 which H-GAC was awarded a grant. She discussed the funding for this project was created by the 88th Texas Legislature which renewed the rider 7 Air Quality Program and its' appropriations for the FY24 25 Biennium for areas not designated nonattainment.

It was further discussed the program was expanded and now to include a separate initiative for areas that are at risk for being nonattainment for PM 2.5 and it appropriated \$2.5 million for more affected counties. We are eligible for this funding due to our region monitored annual PM 2.5 values. Our region will receive over \$400,000 in Rider 7 activity funding during this biennium.

In closing, the discussion continued that they anticipate this project to begin in September and end December 2025.

ITEM 3C. ZEU Plan Introduction-Vinny Polignano, H-GAC

Vinny Polignano gave an overview on study of existing and estimating future vehicle populations in the region. The goal is to assess our ability as a region in terms of changing fueling and future infrastructure needs anticipated with those future vehicle populations. They are looking to assess a guiding document that can direct all those planning efforts in the ZEV space and provide a foundation for future funding opportunities.

The discussion continued with they see zero emission vehicles as an opportunity. This will include the battery electric vehicle or ZEV as well as fuel cell electric vehicles. It was also pointed out that there are about 300,000 EV's in Texas.

Twenty-five percent of which are within the Houston region. Members were informed that their already seeing EVs and we know where we're at. The press space of a hydrogen boom in this region and to adequately account for this extension of ZEV in the region. H-GAC as the region's MPO, is developing a guiding plan.

This project is currently in the beginning stages of reviewing existing ZEV plans.
