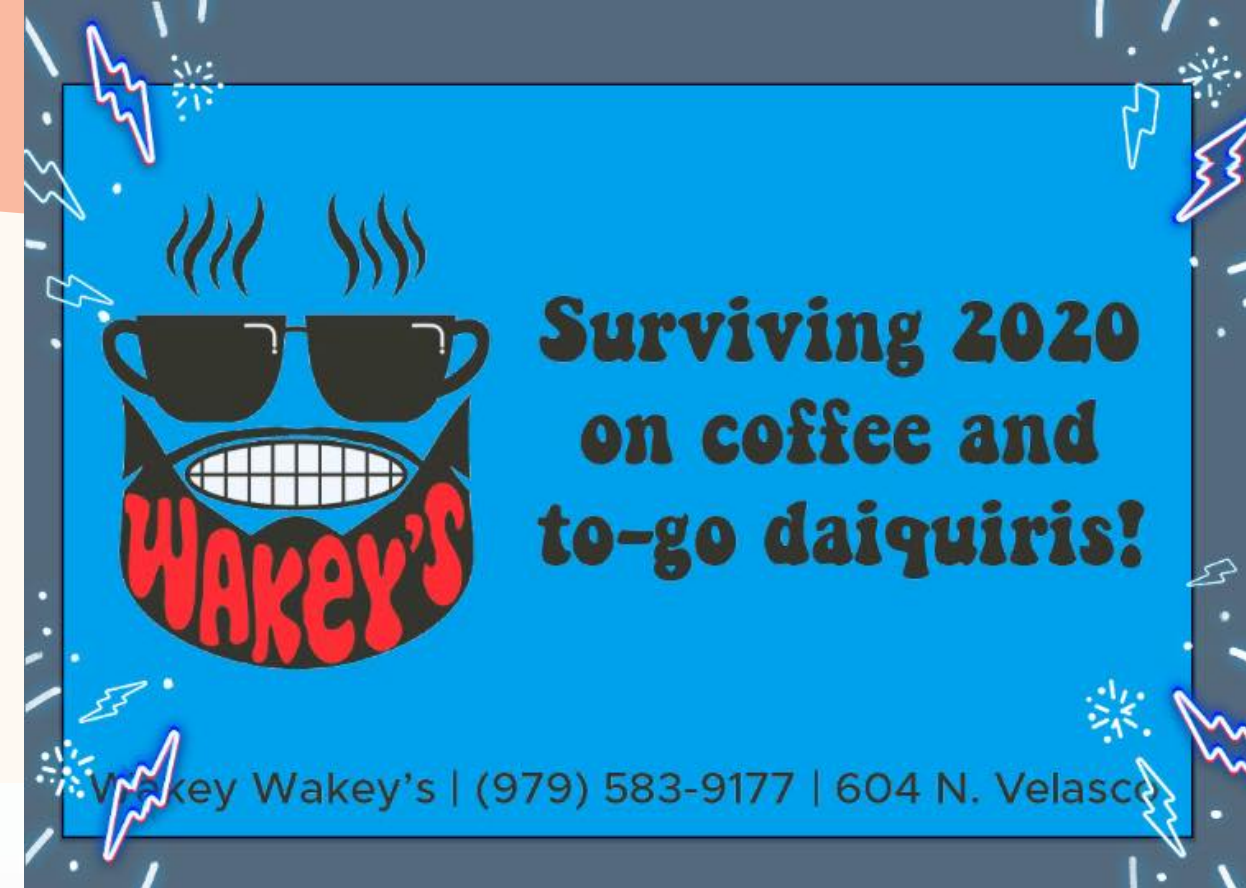

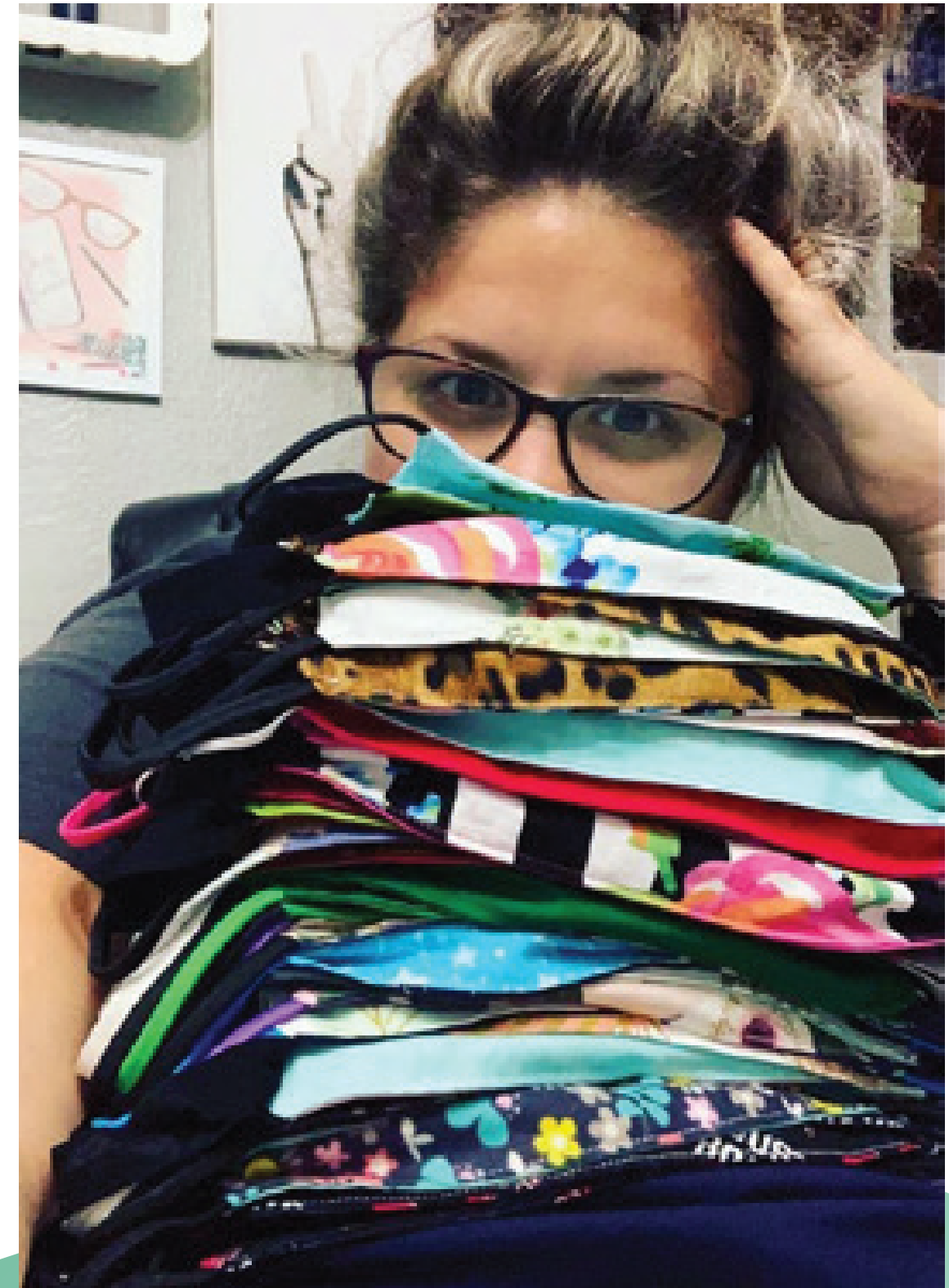
Taking care of the most vulnerable
