4. MINUTES OF THE TRANSPORTATION POLICY COUNCIL FOR THE HOUSTON-GALVESTON TRANSPORTATION MANAGEMENT AREA

ITEM 7. AMENDMENTS TO THE 2021-2024 TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM (TIP) AND THE 2045 REGIONAL TRANSPORTATION PLAN, JIM DICKINSON, H-GAC.

Mr. Jim Dickinson presented on an amendment listed below to the 2021-2024 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) and the 2045 Regional Transportation Plan (RTP).

• Delay the City of Baytown's Garth Road reconstruction and widening project (MPOID 17096/CSJ 0912-72-359) from FY 2022 to FY 2023 at the City's request due to delays in design completion and review. (Total Cost: \$38.2M)

Mr. Dickinson requested TPC approval of Resolution No. 2021-28.

A motion was made by Commissioner Billy Combs and seconded by Council Member David Robinson.

The Council voted and approved TPC Resolution No. 2021-28.

ITEM 8. UPDATE ON CALL FOR PROJECTS, MR. VISHU LINGALA, H-GAC

Mr. Craig Raborn, H-GAC, made introductory comments on the phasing for the upcoming Call for Projects and it's role in reducing the carryover balances for some of their funding sources discussed during the September TPC meeting. Mr. Raborn explained that the Call for Projects will program projects into the Transportation Improvement Program, the 10-Year Plan or the Regional Transportation Plan based on the project readiness.

Mr. Vishu Lingala, H-GAC, proceeded with an update on the Call for Projects and said the TPC had approved the Project Prioritization Guidance last year. The Project Prioritization Guidance provides the goals, priorities and policies for the next Call for Projects. H-GAC staff is still working with the TIP Subcommittee in developing criteria for project selection and process.

Mr. Lingala presented a flowchart to the Council describing the overall project submission and selection process. The graphic highlighted the primary goal of programming projects into the Transportation Improvement Program, the 10-Year Plan and the Regional Transportation Plan. Mr.

Lingala continued his presentation by describing Phase 1 pre-application process. Phase 2 will consist of Benefit/Cost Analysis, Planning Factors under Investment Categories and will be an online process. Staff will continue to review the selection criteria with the TAC Subcommittees, TAC, and TPC.

Mr. Lingala finished his presentation with an updated timeline for the selection and submission process. Staff will present the Call for Projects selection process to the TAC and TPC in February and March of 2022.

A brief question, answer and comment period occurred after this update.

ITEM 9. UPDATE ON THE SOUTHEAST HARRIS COUNTY SUBREGIONAL STUDY, MR. MIKE BURNS, H-GAC

Mr. Mike Burns, H-GAC, provided an update on the Southeast Harris County Subregional Study. The study area consisted of 95 square miles, with a population of 300,000 residents, 25 priority corridors and 100 priority intersections that were identified for both volume of traffic and high-number and severity of crashes. Mr. Burns also said the study area consists of portions of five cities which include Houston, South Houston, Pasadena, Deer Park and La Porte and described members of local governments and agencies that participate on the steering committee. Mr. Burns described the measurable goals developed in coordination with the Steering Committee, Mr. Burns said that the first phase of the study focused on data collection and gathering input on current issues in the study area. Mr. Burns presented a map to the Council that summarized the comments received using an online engagement tool and these comments will be used for the project development phase. Mr. Burns presentation also described the existing conditions and recommended improvements. The study will conclude in early 2022.

ITEM 10. PUBLIC INPUT FROM THE REGIONALLY COORDINATED TRANSPORTATION PLAN, MR. SANFORD KLANFER

Mr. Sandford Klanfer, H-GAC, provided a presentation on the Regionally Coordinated Transportation Plan (RCTP) and said the RCTP focuses on cost-effectively filling gaps in the transportation network. The plan covers all transportation providers, not just public transit agencies and covers the entire 13-county region.

The RCTP update is conducted every five years. The last update was released in 2017 and this update will be released in 2022. An area of concern is the unmet needs of seniors, persons with disabilities, students, and other Environmental Justice populations. Mr. Klanfer described the elements of the plan and provided details on needs assessment, gaps analysis and public outreach process. The first round of outreach occurred in the summer of 2021 and included a public survey and virtual interactive workshops which included a trip planning simulation activity to understand challenges of taking public transit in the region. Mr. Klanfer concluded his update describing the results of the public survey, the project timeline and scheduled focus groups.
