• Trash Bash 2024

Kendall Guidroz shared plans for the 30<sup>th</sup> annual River, Lakes, Bays 'n Bayous Trash Bash scheduled for Saturday, March 23<sup>rd</sup>, 2024. More information can be found on the <u>website</u>.

### • Coastal Communities

Kendall Guidroz gave an update on H-GAC's work with the Coastal Comminities program. The program is designed to help small, coastal communities prevent water pollution by providing resources that evaluate nonpoint source reduction needs, locating funding opportunities, and promoting education and outreach. The program is designed to help small communities without municipal separate storm sewer system permits (MS4) in the coastal areas of Brazoria, Chambers, Galveston, and Matagorda counties engage residents in behavior change to reduce the potential for water pollution. ## • On-site Sewage Facility Projects
