# H-GAC CELEBRATES 55 YEARS OF COOPERATIVE PLANNING AND SERVICE TO THE HOUSTON-GALVESTON REGION

Activities Include a Special Invitation-only Symposium Featuring Long-time H-GAC Leaders, Partners, and University of Houston System Chancellor Renu Khator

**HOUSTON, TX** – In 1966, nine government officials met at Friendswood Town Hall to initiate the regional planning organization that would be the Houston-Galveston Area Council (H-GAC). Their goal was simple. H-GAC would serve as a center of coordinated planning to aid local governments in securing the financing and resources necessary to grow their communities and bring needed services to their residents.

Fifty-five years later, H-GAC has grown into the one of the largest regional cooperative planning organizations in the United States, with a service area that encompasses 13 counties, more than 100 member cities, and more than 7 million residents. With programs and services covering public safety, emergency and disaster planning, transportation and mobility, water quality and solid waste management, environmental conservation, business and economic development, workforce solutions, and aging services, H-GAC has helped cultivate the growth of the Houston-Galveston region into a nationally competitive economic powerhouse, while addressing region-wide challenges and working in tandem with local leaders and partners to improve residents' quality of life.

H-GAC will celebrate its 55th anniversary with a special symposium beginning at 8 a.m. on Friday, Oct. 15 at The Briar Club (2603 Timmons Lane). At the event, H-GAC leaders and partners will pay tribute to H-GAC's accomplishments, discuss the strengths of regional cooperation, and share their vision of where the Houston-Galveston region is headed. It will be invitation-only and will include a networking breakfast, two panel discussions, lunch, and an afternoon keynote presentation featuring Renu Khator, chancellor of the University of Houston System and president of the University of Houston.

"H-GAC's greatest strength has been its ability to foster cooperation. It takes hard work to bring together people from a wide variety of backgrounds and interests to build consensus on how we address the challenges that impact all of us and support the needs of a region as large and
