











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


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


MARCH 3, 2020 PRIMARY ELECTIONS TURNOUT BY VOTE TYPE HARRIS COUNTY (TX)






MARCH 3, 2020 PRIMARY ELECTIONS TURNOUT BY PARTY HARRIS COUNTY (TX)





2020 STATE FACTSHEET POPULATION FACTS

A fifth of the AAPI population in Texas lives in Harris County, which includes Houston.



- Largest AAPI (Asian Americans and Pacific Islanders) ethnic groups in Texas include: Indian (474,699), Vietnamese (295,255), Chinese (254,379), Filipino (204,192), Korean (106,878), Pakistani (71,757).
- From 2012 to 2018, the number of eligible AAPI voters in Texas grew 46%
- This compares to a 12% growth rate for the statewide eligible voting population between 2012 to 2018
- AAPI youth (ages 18-29) comprise 23% of the AAPI CVAP (Citizen Voting Age **Population)** in Texas
- AAPIs age 50 and up comprise 36% of the AAPI CVAP population.



Voting By Mail



VOTING BY MAIL EQUIREMENTS

You may vote early by-mail if you are registered to vote and meet one of the following criteria:

- Away from the county of residence on Election Day and during the early voting period;
- Sick or disabled;
- 65 years of age or older on Election Day;
- or Confined in jail, but eligible to vote.



A voter qualifies as disabled if they believe that their physical condition is such that "in-person voting will cause a likelihood of injury" to their health. Pregnant women are also covered in the disability category.

The Texas Supreme Court ruled last week that a **lack of immunity to COVID may be considered as a factor** in determining whether in-person voting creates a "likelihood of injury" to the voter's health, **but it can't be the sole factor.** It is the responsibility of voters to make their own health determinations, and the County Clerk's Office does not have the authority to question the voter's judgment.¹

If the voter fills out a vote-by-mail application and indicates one of the four grounds under which they would be eligible to receive a ballot by mail, the Clerk's Office must accept that application as-is and send the voter a ballot.



Election Clerk

1,000 election workers needed for the Early Voting period 8,000 plus election workers needed for Election Day



Qualifications:

- a registered voter in Harris County,
- have transportation to and from the polling location
- be able to attend training.
- Bilingual election workers are needed and encouraged to apply.
- Students 16 years of age and older can apply to work as student clerks.

All of these positions are paid.

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Voting Safely



Voting Safely



- When you arrive at the polling location, there will be some new process and procedures in place to keep voters, poll workers, and the general public safe.
- Each polling location will have a sanitization station to provide hand sanitizer before and after voting.
- eSlate machines will be placed 6 feet apart to allow for social distancing.
- There will be markers indicating where to stand to ensure social distancing while voters are waiting to be checked in.
- Voters will be given finger covers so that they can operate the voting machine without physically touching it.
