8B. AMENDMENTS TO THE 2025-2028 TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM AND THE 2045 REGIONAL TRANSPORTATION PLAN

BACKGROUND

The 2025-2028 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) is a four-year capital improvements program for transportation projects. Under federal rules, all federally assisted projects must be included in the TIP to be eligible for funding. In addition, federal rules require that regionally significant local projects must also be included in the TIP.

The 2045 Regional Transportation Plan (RTP) is a long-range plan that prioritizes spending on regional transportation projects including short and long-range strategies to ensure the transportation network is safe and efficient. Updated every four years, the RTP outlines a fiscally constrained transportation investment program that is based on the unique needs and characteristics of the MPO region.

Amendments to the TIP and RTP are brought to the Transportation Policy Council for consideration monthly and amended in accordance with the H-GAC Public Participation Plan.

CURRENT SITUATION

A summary of the proposed revision to the Texas Department of Transportation Statewide Bicycle and Pedestrian Program is included below.

 Program 3.7M Transportation Development Credits (TDCs) in lieu of matching funds for the Uptown Management District's Transportation Alternative Set-Aside (TASA) funded West Loop Shared-Use Path construction project.

A summary of the proposed revision to the 2025-2028 Transportation Improvement Program is included below.

 Program an additional \$993K of federal Congestion Mitigation/Air Quality (CMAQ) funds, matched with local funds by the City of Bellaire, to cover the increased cost estimates that are due to inflation. The project scope will also be modified to use the most appropriate technology.

WHEREAS, the proposed revisions to the 2025-2028 Transportation Improvement Program are consistent with the 2045 Regional Transportation Plan and its finding of conformance with the State Implementation Plan for air quality; and

WHEREAS, the proposed revisions to the 2025-2028 Transportation Improvement Program are consistent with the federal fiscal constraint requirements established for the Transportation Improvement Program and are consistent with the financially constrained 2045 Regional Transportation Plan.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE TRANSPORTATION POLICY COUNCIL (TPC) FOR THE HOUSTON-GALVESTON METROPOLITAN PLANNING AREA THAT THE 2025–2028 TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM AND THE 2045 REGIONAL TRANSPORTATION PLAN BE AMENDED TO REFLECT THE REVISIONS IDENTIFIED IN THE TABLE OF NOVEMBER 2024 TPC AMENDMENTS.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT FEDERAL FUNDS AUTHORIZED BY THE TPC FROM THE CONGESTION MITIGATION AND AIR QUALITY (CMAQ) AND SURFACE TRANSPORTATION BLOCK GRANT (STBG) PROGRAMS REPRESENT A LIMITING AMOUNT. ANY COST OVERRUNS ON PHASES OF WORK AUTHORIZED BY THE TPC OR COSTS INCURRED ON PHASES OF WORK NOT AUTHORIZED BY THE TPC SHALL BE THE RESPONSIBILITY OF THE PROJECT SPONSOR. IN NO CASE, SHALL FEDERAL PARTICIPATION UNDER THE CMAQ AND STBG PROGRAMS BE INCREASED WITHOUT CONSULTATION AND THE EXPRESS APPROVAL OF THE TPC.

Please explain how the use of TDCs will help meet the priority established for this project.

The project meets the priority of support of federal transit funding through its nexus with public transportation. The proposed shared-use path will serve several existing public transportation stops/stations within a ½ mile walk-shed of the project limits and many more within a three-mile bike-shed of the project limits. The project serves to connect transit service at Post Oak Boulevard with the Northwest Transit Center via alternative transportation options. The project closes a multimodal mobility gap relating to safety, access, and connectivity that Uptown and its project partners have been working to address since approximately 2015.

Transit Project

Explain and document the effect the TDC's will have on local and non-federal funding support for existing transit services.

• Uptown Houston District (HCID 1) is requesting Transportation Development Credits (TDCs) through H-GAC for the West Loop Shared Use Path and Bayou Bridge project. • The federal funding for the project was awarded by TxDOT (\$18.4M). This award was made in part due to the project's size and regional significance. • In addition to the TxDOT award, Uptown was also awarded \$4M in earmark funding. The earmark funding does not require a local match, but cannot be used to match the TxDOT funding. • The availability of the earmark plus the TxDOT federal money is anticipated to allow the project to be implemented (~\$22.4M budget, using all federal funds). • As such, it is efficient and logical to apply the TDCs to the TxDOT funding as they will allow for the maximum leverage and utilization of all of the allocated federal funds in relation to the total project cost and budget. The allocation of TDCs will support alternative mode and public transit options and will allow other local and non-federal funding from the Uptown Houston District to be allocated towards other mobility improvement planning, development, and implementation projects.
