Purpose of Amendment:

Program additional federal funds to cover the shortfall on the Montrose Management District's US 59/IH 69 bridge lighting project.

Based on discussions with the TxDOT Houston District, the additional costs are proposed to be split equally between the Management District, TxDOT and H-GAC (\$664,717 each). If H-GAC elects to participate funding would be programmed using STP-MM funds allocated to the MPO.
