Monisha Khurana

Monisha Khurana, AICP, is the Chief Operations Officer at The Goodman Corporation. She is a transportation planner with a background in travel demand modeling and has nearly a decade of experience in the transportation industry. Monisha joined The Goodman Corporation in 2017 and serves as a project manager and technical lead on a variety of projects, including mobility strategies and performance-based plans. She is responsible for managing projects to ensure that quality products are delivered on-schedule and on-budget. Her multimodal transportation planning experience includes cost-benefit analyses, statewide plans, regional and Metropolitan Planning Organization projects, corridor studies, transit projects and freight plans. Monisha holds an undergraduate degree from Wellesley College and a master's degree in City and Regional Planning from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill.



Bart Baker

Bart Baker is the Executive Vice President and Chief Operating Officer for the North Houston District. In his role, he works with the president to set the direction and strategic plans for all departments. He also oversees the Operations, Planning and Infrastructure department, which includes services and projects related to transportation, mobility, beautification, and the area's public parks and trail system. In 2008, Bart developed the District's *Parks, Recreation and Open Space Plan* to guide the area's development of green spaces. Today, the District is home to seven parks totaling more than 36 acres. Prior to joining the District, Bart worked for the City of Beaumont, serving as a senior planner. Bart earned his master's degree in Urban Planning and his bachelor's degree in Environmental Design from Texas A&M University.



Donald Buaku

Donald Buaku, AICP, Associate member of the American Institute of Architects, is a Planner Manager and the Urban Design Lead in the Multimodal Safety & Design Branch of the Transportation & Drainage Operations service line of Houston Public Works. Donald is originally from Ghana where he earned a bachelor's degree in Architecture and a postgraduate diploma in Architecture from KNUST University.
