INFORMATION ITEMS

Item3 – Development of the Project Evaluation Criteria (Vishu Lingala)

The entire meeting was devoted to this item. Vishu Lingala began by highlighting the progress achieved in the project evaluation criteria development effort. He then began to discuss the evaluation criteria for the ten (10) planning factors.

- 1. **Safety**: Crash rates will be evaluated based on the functional classification of the facility. For new facilities, the analysis will be based on crash rates on an existing parallel facility for which the proposed roadway will be an alternate route.
- 2. **Multimodal Improvements:** For non-freeway roadway projects, points will be awarded based on (1) Sidewalks provided for Pedestrian use, (2) Accommodations created for bicycle use, and (3) Whether transit service would benefit from the proposed improvements. For limited access highways or freeways, points will be awarded based on whether the project will improve transit service on HOV/Managed Lanes, or whether transit service will be improved on general purpose lanes.

For further consideration: How to treat a Shared Use Path

- 3. **Congestion Management:** This analysis evaluates performance measures such as the Planning Time Index 95, Truck Planning Time Index 80, Person-Hours Delays, and Truck Person-Hours Delays. For new facilities, the analysis will be based on the performance measures on an existing parallel roadway for which the new facility would be an alternate route. The analysis will also consider a Delay Reduction Factor.
- 4. **Resiliency:** The resiliency evaluation will assess a combination of factors that include how critical a roadway is to the regional network, the roadway's vulnerability to flooding, the risk of a storm surge, and the roadway's level of redundancy. These factors are built into the H-GAC Regional Resiliency Tool which computes a composite resiliency metric score. Discussions on the criticality of particular roadway facilities and on how to measure a proposed project's impact on resiliency are reserved for a future date.
- 5. **Connectivity:** Comprises an evaluation of a proposed project's impact on connectivity to regional activity centers and is evaluated by access to jobs. Urban areas will be distinguished from the non-urban areas in the analysis. The Connectivity evaluation will also consider a project's response to at-grade railroad crossings.

- 6. **Equity:** The Equity question concerns whether a proposed project will, in its totality, provide value to a traditionally underserved and/or vulnerable community. The evaluation will consider a project's impact on accessibility and connectivity in these neighborhoods, balanced against whether the project will cause a disproportional displacement of members of the protected population. Census block-groups sensitive for the presence of members of traditionally underserved and vulnerable communities are identified in H-GAC's Regional Equity Tool.
- 7. Planning Coordination: Will be discussed in a future meeting.
- 8. Urban Rural Transitioning: Will be discussed in a future meeting.
- 9. Environmental/Ecological: Will be discussed in a future meeting.
- 10. Functional Class/Freight Networks: Will be discussed in a future meeting.

<u>Timeline</u>: It is envisaged that the Project Evaluation Criteria Development will be completed by May 2021 and be taken to the TAC and TPC for information/action about June/July 2021. This would facilitate the commencement of the Call for Projects about October, 2021.
