- <u>TFMA's 2025 Higher Standards Survey</u>: TFMA has conducted an annual "Freeboard Survey" since 2004. The purpose of this survey is to document community efforts to adopt standards higher than the NFIP minimum requirements and to share this information with other cities and counties in Texas. *This survey contains 11 questions and should take no longer than 15 minutes to complete.*
 - Please provide input for your community by providing information regarding your floodplain management program by <u>addressing the questions in this survey by July</u> 31.

- TFMA Texas Chapter Annual Technical Summit, August 26, 2025 August 29, 2025 The TFMA Technical Summit is recognized for its dynamic programming, quality presentations, and information on the latest advances in the practice of floodplain management and other industry-related fields. The information presented, and collaborative environment provided, enhances attendees' ability to provide guidance and services to their organizations, therefore enhancing your professional development skills.
 - FEMA's Public Assistance Program and Policy Guide Updates: Commonly referred to as the PAPPG, promotes consistent application of the federal statutes and regulations related to the Public Assistance (PA) program. FEMA updates the PAPPG annually when necessary and conducts a comprehensive review at least every three years. Version 5 (V5) of the PAPPG includes significant policy changes, additional guidance, and formatting updates that improve clarity and readability. Note, this version applies to disasters declared on or after January 6, 2025.
 - FEMA Updates Benefit Cost Analysis Discount Rates for Mitigation Projects as Office of Management and Budget Adjusts Rates

A calculation FEMA uses to determine cost effectiveness of mitigation projects has returned to its original amount. The Benefit-Cost Analysis discount rate has been adjusted from 3.1% to 7% following recent action by the Office of Management and Budget (OMB). On April 8, 2025, OMB revoked a recent update to Circular No. A-94, "Guidelines and Discount Rates for Benefit-Cost Analysis of Federal Programs," to return the discount rate to the original amount set in October 1992. BCA Toolkit and will release additional guidance on the applicability, timing and content updates.
