ITEM 7. AMENDMENTS TO THE 2045 REGIONAL TRANSPORTATION PLAN (RTP) AND 2021-2024 TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM, MR JIM DICINSON, H-GAC

Mr. Jim Dickinson, H-GAC, presented information on Amendment to the 2045 RTP and 2021-2023 TIP.

- Program the \$896K City of Conroe FY 2020 Federal Transit Administration Buses and Bus Facilities (Section 5339) award in FY 2021 of the 2021-2024 Transportation Improvement Program. The award will be matched with \$224K of local funding and used to purchase transit vehicles.
- Program two FY 2019 Federal Railroad Administration Consolidated Rail Infrastructure and Safety Improvements program awards in FY 2021 of the 2021-2024 Transportation Improvement Program. The \$700K City of Dayton Rail Crossings Improvement Project award will be matched with \$300K of local funds. It will provide for preliminary engineering, environmental analysis and documentation necessary to improve four at-grade crossings on Union Pacific Railroad track. The \$666K Greater Southeast Management District award will be matched with \$334K of local funds. It will provide alternatives analysis, preliminary engineering and federal environmental analysis, and documentation to grade-separate four current at-grade highway-rail crossings at the intersection of Griggs Road, Mykawa Road, and Long Drive with Union Pacific Railroad and Burlington Northern Santa Fe Railway in Houston.
- Program the City of Houston Antoine Drive 6-lane widening project in FY 2025 of the Ten-Year Plan (10Y). The 2018 Call-for-Projects \$79M federal Surface Transportation Block Grant (STBG) award will be matched with \$39M of local funds. The five-mile project includes turn lanes, pedestrian, bicyclist and intersection improvements and construction of a railroad grade separation.

Mr. Dickinson requested approval of Resolution No. 2020-34.

ITEM 8. UPDATE TO THE FEDERAL FUNCTIONAL CLASSIFICATION SYSTEM, ADAM BECK

Mr. Adam Beckom provided information to the Council on the proposed updates to the FFCS. TxDOT is requesting an update to three Waller county roadways:

Woods/Jordan Road

Update the federal functional classification of Woods/Jordan Road in Waller County from Local to Major Collector from IH 10 to US 90 (0.617 miles). Woods/Jordan Road is proposed to be widened from 2 to 4-lanes with left turn treatments. This project (MPOID: 241) is programmed in fiscal year 2024 of the 2021-2024 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP).

Cardiff Road

Update the federal functional classification of Cardiff Road in Waller County from Local to Major Collector between US 90 and Morton Road (2.058 miles).

Morton Road

Update the federal functional classification of Morton Road in Waller County from Local to Major Collector between FM 2855 and FM 362 (4.175 miles).

These proposed functional classification updates are consistent with Waller County's major thoroughfare plan and the FHWA functional classification update requirements.

Mr. Beckom requested approval of Resolution No. 2020-35

A motion was made by Commissioner Grady Prestage and seconded by Mayor Tom Reid. The Council voted and approved Resolution No. 2020-35.

Mr. Gage proceeded to show the Council a graph and pointed out the federal projections versus actual fatalities in the region.

Ms. Jamila Owens, H-GAC, introduced Mr. Sean Middleton, Interim Executive Director, Gulf Coast Transit District. Mr. Middleton presented information on the transfer of designated recipient status for Section 5307 Urbanized Area Formula Grant funds and Section 53339 and Bus Facilities Grant funds for the Texas City/La Marque and Lake Jackson/Angleton UZAs from the Gulf Coast Center to the Gulf Coast Transit District.

ITEM 12. BRIEFING ON FUTURE AMENDMENTS TO THE TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM AND REGIONAL TRANSPORTATION PROGRAM

Mr. Jim Dickinson presented a briefing on future TPC Amendments to the TIP and RTP. He described the following projects:

- Program a US 59 South Intelligent Transportation System (ITS) installation project from east of SS 529 to the Wharton County line in FY 2021 of the 2021-2024 Transportation Improvement Program with \$3.5M of State Category-2 funding. The project will adjoin the previously programmed FY 2021 \$3.8M Category-2 IH 69 ITS installation project which extends the corridor north to SH 99.
- Split the SH 36/SS 10 Intelligent Transportation System (ITS) installation project into two facility-specific sections and delay the SH 36 section into FY 2026 of the Ten-Year Plan.
- Adjust federal and state funding amounts of Category-2 (Metropolitan Mobility), Category-3 (Design/Build) and Category-4 (Statewide Connectivity) programmed on four projects on IH-10 W, IH-45 S, SH 225 and SH 105 to reconcile with the approved Texas Department of Transportation FY 2021 Unified Transportation Plan.

ITEM 13. PRESENTATION ON THE 10-YEAR PLAN, VISHU LINGALA, H-GAC

Mr. Vishu Lingala, H-GAC, presented on the draft 2021 H-GAC 10-year plan which includes a list of funded projects programmed to be let between fiscal years 2021 – 2030. The plan is updated every year. It includes more than \$9 billion total federal, state, and local funds previously programmed by the Transportation Policy Council. Approval of 10-year plan provides concurrence with Unified Transportation Program based on consistency with TIP and RTP. The draft 10-year list does not include projects funded with Federal Transit Administration formula funds. The Draft 10-Year Plan will be brought back for TPC approval in November and submitted to the state in December.
