## **GDW Meeting Summary for August 3, 2022**

2022 Houston Area GIS Day Planning Update: Brooks Andrews with H-GAC and Nicole Ceranek with Montgomery County, TX updated the GDW on the planning progress for the Houston Area GIS Day taking place in November. The exciting news shared was that the 2022 event has an official date of Wednesday, November 16, 2022 and official venue in the University of Houston – Clear Lake (UHCL). Since the last GDW update on this item, the schedule and activities for both professionals and students are starting to come together and should really start to take shape now that the date and venue has been made official. The very next action item is updating the website with the date and venue information and starting to get the schedule of events together and posted as well. The next planning meeting is set for Thursday, August 18<sup>th</sup> at 11am CST where the planning committee will continue to establish roles and responsibilities for planning the 2022 event. Additionally, the next day on Friday, August 19th at 1pm CST is the site visit at UHCL where carpooling options will be available for those who want to visit the site to get a feel for how the event will work at UHCL this year. 2022 H-GAC Aerial Imagery Cost-Share Update: Brooks Andrews with H-GAC discussed the status of the 2022 H-GAC Aerial Imagery project and the next steps in cost-share program. Currently, the final project deliverables are being disbursed by H-GAC to all participating cost-share members. As of Wednesday, August 3<sup>rd</sup>, 22 orders have been completed and mailed out or are awaiting payment, 2 orders are in progress, and 8 orders are waiting to be started after receiving the final deliverables on Friday, July 15<sup>th</sup>. The data did take a bit longer this year to be delivered due to the total 17 TB size of the final deliverables and the time allowed for the user QA/QC period in June, but H-GAC anticipates to have all cost-share orders completed and either mailed out or ready to be mailed out after receiving payment on Friday, August 5<sup>th</sup>. Once an order is ready, H-GAC will email the cost-share participant for a signed license agreement, conformation of the mailing address, and payment if it hasn't been already received. If you are awaiting your imagery and haven't heard from H-GAC yet it is likely because your cost-share

order is still unpaid as paid orders are processed and delivered first. After all orders have been processed and mailed or waiting to be mailed, H-GAC will contact Surdex to set up the 2022 streaming imagery services for all participating cost-share members to consume as well. These streaming imagery services will be hosted by dedicated Surdex imagery servers and should be ready to use by early September and will last two full years from the date of production.
