HOUSTON-GALVESTON AREA COUNCIL ANNOUNCES JUSTIN BOWER AS NEW DIRECTOR OF COMMUNITY AND ENVIRONMENTAL PLANNING

HOUSTON – The Houston-Galveston Area Council (H-GAC) recently announced it has hired Justin Bower as its new director of community and environmental planning. He began his new position on Jan. 30. Bower succeeds Jeff Taebel, who retired last spring after 35 years of service.

As community and environmental director, Bower will lead the agency's natural resources, disaster resilience, community planning, and public safety programs.
