Why or why not to question 2?	Tighter WWTF permit limits, Regional Assessment, Increase Awareness
What I-Plan actions or activities do you think work effectively?	 Outreach/ residential education for FOG reduction to prevent SSOs; Increased efforts to reduce illicit discharges; continue WQ monitoring; OSSFs monitoring and replacement - use of data to drive focus.
What I-Plan actions or activities do you think are important to keep in the I-Plan revision?	Education/Outreach about Stream point testing results - dependent on committee recommendations.
What I-Plan actions or activities have been under utilized or could be expanded upon?	Research and outreach to local decision makers
