On behalf of the Pearland Economic Development Corporation Board of Directors (PEDC), an organization dedicated to promoting the economic development of the City of Pearland, I am writing to express our organization's unanimous support for the five projects submitted by the City of Pearland to the 2018 TIP Call for Projects. These projects include four roadway projects (Bailey Road Expansion, Max Road Expansion, Harkey Road Expansion, and Kinglsey Drive Expansion) and one trail project (Green Tee Trail Connection to Independence Park).

PEDC believes that the five proposed projects will help alleviate traffic congestion in our region. Pearland sits between various economic engines of the Gulf Coast Region. This strategic location has led to explosive growth in Pearland during the last decade. Pearland is the fastest growing city in the Houston region. As of January 2018, the population of Pearland is estimated at 125,000, with an additional 24,800 residents in the ETJ. Pearland offers outstanding schools, safe neighborhoods, affordable housing, and superb quality of life. This has led to tremendous growth in Pearland with millions of square feet of retail, office and residential construction completed in the past 10 years.

Pearland's rapid growth has led to significant commercial growth in our community, which is currently ranked one of the 50 largest retail centers in the State of Texas. This continued growth has made Pearland a hub for new residents and businesses, which are now suffering from increased traffic congestion.

The existing Bailey Road expansion to a four-lane divided roadway was completed in 2018 between FM1128 and Veterans Drive. The proposed expansion project will continue the four-lane divided cross section from Veterans Drive east to State Highway 35. Completing this expansion, including widening the overpass at the BNSF railroad, will improve an alternate, shorter route for residents, school traffic, emergency vehicles and through traffic to Veterans Drive, CR 101, State Highway 35 and other areas south of Pearland.

Max Road is a two-lane open ditch roadway and is proposed to be extended and realigned from Hughes Ranch Road to the future extension of McHard Road. Improving the road to a four-lane divided cross section will provide added safety and will address traffic congestion by adding a north-south alternative route for residents and commuters using State Highway 35 to access both Beltway 8 and Interstate 610.

Harkey Road is also a two-lane open ditch roadway and is proposed to be expanded to a four-lane divided cross section from FM 518 to Bailey Road. Crash records have shown that the section of Harkey Road is

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ranked the 4th highest in Pearland for the number of fatalities and injuries per 100 crashes. Upgrading the road will greatly increase vehicle and pedestrian safety in the area.

Kingsley Drive is located in both Brazoria and Harris Counties and provides a connection between FM 2234 and Beltway 8, and is an alternate north-south route to FM 521 and State Highway 288. Kingsley Drive was previously improved from a two-lane open ditch road to a four-lane divided cross section from FM 2234 to Clear Creek, but remains a two-lane open ditch road to Beltway 8. The roadway crosses a growing industrial area, including the Lower Kirby Pearland Management District, which has increased \$213M in value in the last five years. The roadway has also experienced significant growth, including heavy truck traffic, and the proposed widening is needed to improve safety and access.

The proposed Independence Trail segment will provide a connection from Clear Creek to one of the City's regional parks, Independence Park. Clear Creek currently has multiple existing trail segments and future segments are planned to connect a trail along the entire Pearland City limits, approximately 18 miles. Independence is currently undergoing a major renovation, in which the City is investing \$3.5M. The trail connection will provide regional access from various residential areas to the two facilities as well as to commercial and employment opportunities in between.

The Pearland Economic Development Corporation's Board of Directors believes that these proposed projects are essential to relieve traffic congestion and support the economic vibrancy of not only the City of Pearland, but our entire region. Failure to approve these projects would significantly add further to our area's traffic congestion and seriously inhibit the full economic potential of the region. We appreciate your consideration of these projects and your work on behalf of our region.
