Dear Mr. Clark:

The Houston Parks and Recreation Department (HPARD) is pleased to nominate Kingwood Pedestrian/Bicycle Connections (the Project) to the 2015 TIP Call for Projects. The Project is consistent with the Regional Transportation Plan's identified needs, goals and program of projects. It reflects the needs of the City of Houston to expand and connect bicyclists and pedestrians to the City's multimodal transportation system via safe off and on street access routes in the Kingwood area. The Project helps fulfill the connectivity goals of the Bayou Greenways 2020 (BG2020) initiative to create a continuous system of 150 miles of bike/ped trails along Houston's bayous within city limits.

The Project total cost is \$9,571,660. HPARD requests 79% of project cost in the amount of \$7,561,611.72. The Houston Parks Board is providing a 21% match of \$2,010,048.68 from voter-approved bond funds for BG2020. The Project is ready for implementation within the time period proposed under TIP. Once complete, the trail will be maintained by the Houston Parks Board in accordance with the BG2020 Economic Development Agreement with the City of Houston. HPARD's application package includes evidence of HPB's maintenance, as well as financial commitment to the matching funds as required to supplement the federal aid requested.

We look forward to your positive review of our project nomination.

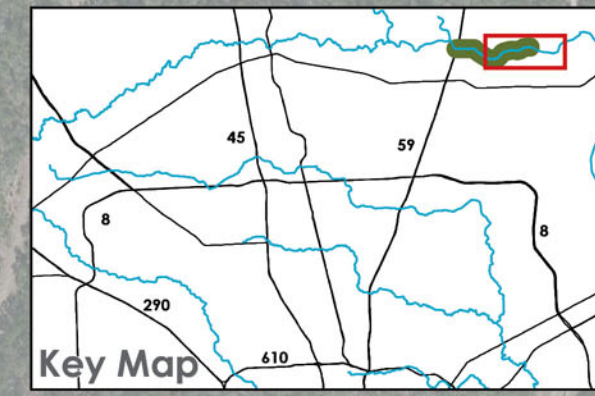
