On behalf of Buffalo Bayou Partnership, I am writing to enthusiastically support the Texas Department of Transportation's application for federal funding for the Buffalo Bayou Heritage Corridor project. The trail and bridge restoration that would be constructed with the funding will greatly enhance Buffalo Bayou Partnership's efforts to provide trail connectivity along Buffalo Bayou. Because we feel so strongly about this project, Buffalo Bayou Partnership is providing a portion of the matching funds that are required.

Working with TxDOT and the City of Houston west of downtown, BBP has successfully implemented many miles of trails.
