Dear Mr. Raborn:

On behalf of Harris County Precinct 3, I am writing to notify you of Harris County's grant application request under the High-Growth Area Needs Category of the Houston-Galveston Area Council's (H-GAC) 2023 Project Selection Process.

The proposed project on Barker Cypress Road, which is primarily in existing right-of-way, widens Barker Cypress Road from four to six lanes, converting it from a four-lane asphalt section with open ditch drainage to a six-lane concrete urban section with curb-and-gutter including added sidewalks. The project also includes reconstruction of the bridge over the railroad, and intersection improvements along Barker Cypress Road at Queenston Boulevard and US 290 eastbound and westbound frontage roads. The improvements will reduce congestion and the resulting vehicular emissions, increase safety in the area, improve pedestrian accommodations, improve drainage by modernizing the roadway with curbs and gutters, and decrease the travel delays that currently impact the Barker Cypress Corridor. This project will provide significant and measurable benefits to everyone who utilizes this corridor, and will help support the vibrant growth of the area.

The grant request includes \$48,000,000 in federal funds with \$12,000,000 in matching funds provided by Harris County Precinct 3, for a total project cost of \$60,000,000. This project focuses on improving safety, mobility, economic competitiveness, equity in transportation, and community connectivity.
